The need arose for me to go to Destin for a “Special Meeting” to work on resolving the internal dispute due to the ladies taking issue with Pat Carpenter. November 21 we had a District meeting. After the meeting I was charged with the task of asking for the resignations for the President and Treasurer of Unit 221 due to the results of the audit. In addition, charges were brought up on both of them. I spent several days working with the unit to help them continue to deal with the everyday operation of the unit.

Shirley Frazer came back to District 1 for the hearing at Unit 221. The ladies were found not guilty and both resigned their position. Along with the President and Treasurer. The Chaplain, Historian and 1st Vice resigned.

Our second ABC School was in Panama City at Unit 392. We had a great turnout. I believe having one 2 ABC Schools help with the attendance since travel was easier for both sections of the District.

I made several more trips to Niceville to show the appointed treasurer how to keep the books and create a finance report.

It took several more visits to Niceville to help get them on track and it seemed they were. I was asked to audit the books again since the Unit wanted to be sure they were managing the books properly. The books were perfect. We had two small errors that were easily corrected. One being 3 small items were on a receipt and should not have been reimbursed. The other, a receipt was missing, but a copy replaced the missing original.

I was called to Niceville once again because the appointed Treasurer had some grievances. We held a meeting with the ladies who she took issue with and discovered her complaints had no merit.

April 30 we had our DCC and elected Pat Carpenter as our District President for year 2016-2017. I look forward to working with Pat and following her leadership.

In May I went to Unit 402 (still waiting for their charter from National) and helped them hold their elections. They just want to hit the ground running when they get their charter. They are already organizing a 5k for the Veterans.

I also was asked to go back to Niceville and conduct the elections. During the meeting several officers resigned and refused to run again. If this action was not corrected, the Unit would not have any officers for 2016-2017. After some counseling of the unit, we had an election and Unit 221 is moving forward. There is still dissention there and probably will be for a while.
