Who can receive AEF?

Application for members affected by Natural Disaster:

Must be an ALA member for 3 consecutive years, (The current year and past 2). Application must be received with in the 6months of disaster.

Grant may be awarded up to \$2400 from National.

Application for members needing temporary assistance:

AEF may provide temporary assistance to eligible member during financial crisis when no other source of aid is readily available to pay for shelter, food, and utilities. Grants may be awarded up to #2400.Will not pay medical and credit card debt.
