
Americanism

Secretary's Desk



Girls State...
We still have openings for this year's program. If you are interested in receiving another application for Girls State, mail \$350 to

Department. If you have not already completed registration paperwork you must complete the form and mail it along with your check. If you are already registered for Girls State it is not necessary to complete another form. Simply mail a check and another application will be mailed to you. Do not call the office to ask us to hold a spot, as we will not. It is first come, first served based on receipt of money.

I must ask that you double check the applications before mailing back to Department to make sure they are complete. Any incomplete applications will be returned to you. This includes all signatures and selection date of the unit.

Test Units... if you think your unit is supposed to be a test unit and you do not have any information to get on line, contact us immediately. All units that have requested to be test units have been set-up as test units but we are finding that many units did not recognize the email that came from national with their login and deleted it by mistake. Department has paid the fee for all units that requested to go live to have access to the system and we want you to be using it. If you are a test unit of record you are required to input new members and will get them back if you mail them to Department. Please help us get these records corrected as soon as possible.

To those units that are inputting new members, remember to use upper and lower case letters. I know some of you find it easier to type all in upper case, but National does not allow this. Also, be careful to input seniors and juniors separately. You must go all the way through to the receipt phase before beginning the other. If you don't you will make them all either seniors or juniors.

Once they are put in, mail the applications, recap and check to Department. Either mail the receipt or mark the recap in some way to let us know they are in the system.

If you have a change to who is to have access to the live system notify us. We have to notify National to cancel the old login and create a new one. Please do not make changes unless necessary.

Just to give you an update, the IRS is causing the delay in National going live. I do not have any details but have been told by National that the delay has to do with the IRS. As I learn more, I will pass the information on.

Transfers... NO members can transfer at this time without 2013 dues paid. Only members in good standing are allowed to transfer and if 2013 dues are not paid they are no longer in good standing. There will be no exceptions to this.

Donations... donations to the Department projects, VA facilities and Children's Hospitals are very low. Please have fundraisers and make donations to support these important facilities. Use a Donation Remittance Form when mailing money to Department and checks should be made payable to ALA Dept of FL.

Remember, the deadline for donations to reach Department to count for the 2012-13 year is April 30th. Any money received after that date will count for the 2013-14 year. There will be no exception to this! Make sure you get Child Welfare and Special Olympic money in by April 30th!

Honorary Membership... there seems to be some confusion about honorary memberships. A unit may award an honorary life membership. The rule is a Unit may award an honorary life membership to a member of their unit for years of dedicated service. A unit may not, under any circumstance, award a honorary life membership to someone that is not otherwise eligible for the organization. No matter how dedicated they are to serving the unit. If they do not meet our eligibility requirements; a unit may not vote to award them any type of membership, per the National Judge Advocate. This jeopardizes the IRS non-profit status of the organization. Every member of your unit must be able to provide valid proof of eligibility for the American Legion Auxiliary. No Unit or Post has the

authority to waive the rules of eligibility for any reason.

People that are not eligible for our organization can make valuable volunteers for our organization and should certainly be recognized and welcomed. Do not get caught giving them membership cards or falsifying membership records for them. Doing so only jeopardizes your charter.

The Poppy Train



Are you on board "The Poppy Train"? If not, now is the time to get on board. If your Poppy Days are in May, around Memorial Day, your poppy order should already be in. Poppy orders are due to Department 90 days prior to Poppy Days. Orders received after the deadline will be rejected. According to my calculations (and these numbers are approximate), last year from July thru April 155 Units had ordered poppies. Poppy orders were around \$14,600 and proceeds about \$12,000. So far this year (July thru Jan.) (again approximation) 73 Units have ordered poppies – Poppy orders \$7,665 and proceeds \$5,066. We are about one-half way there, but in the beginning of the year I asked everyone to "kick it up a notch" and exceed the prior year's numbers. National is promoting the Poppy program strenuously this year as the Poppy Program is literally dieing. We don't want to see this valuable program fail, so, please get those poppy orders in; get out there, and promote this important program. Dates to remember – Unit Poppy Reports are due to District Chairman by April 15. District Poppy Reports are due to Department Chairman by May 1. Dorothy Pederson-Wiley Award entries are due to Department Chairman 30 days prior to Department Convention. Poppy Poster Contest and Little Miss Poppy entries are due to Department Chairman by May 1, 2013. PLEASE make sure you read and follow all rules exactly. If you submit any entry, please make sure you pick your entry up immediately following the conclusion of Department Convention. Department will NOT mail your entries back. HOW TO PLAN A HEALTH FAIR FOR HOMELESS VETERANS

10 STEPS TO A SUCCESSFUL ONE-DAY STAND DOWN

According to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, there are more than 100,000 homeless veterans on the streets on any given night. A stand down is a grassroots effort to help homeless veterans by offering a hand up, not a handout through a one- to three-day event concentrated on food, shelter, clothing, health, benefits counseling, and/or job counseling services. Since homelessness ages an individual approximately 20 years beyond his/her actual age, health fairs offer focused, much needed help through services that can include health care screenings and care services, vision and dental care or referrals, VA benefits counseling, governmental benefits counseling or referrals (Social Security, food stamps, etc.), substance abuse counseling, and mental health counseling or referrals. Additional services can include foot care, shoes, and socks. The best way to get started planning for a stand down is to download the National Stand Down Program Guide at http://www.nchv.org/images/uploads/Stand%20Down%20Guide.pdf. Be sure to check out Wisconsin Unit 53's success story on page 18.

GET READY... PLANNING AND PREPARATION

- 1. After you've downloaded the program guide, visit www.va.gov/homeless to see if a stand down is already planned for your area. If so, consider volunteering at this event before planning your own.
- 2. Approach the Homeless Outreach office at the VA Medical Center in your area, and tell them your unit is planning a stand down. Ask for the approximate number of homeless veterans in your area.
- 3. Determine when and where you would like to host the event. Consider your climate when deciding to have the event. If you are planning to host it outside, find a large, open space that is cost-effective to rent, or ask a local church or school to host the event for free.
- 4. Secure any necessary permits.
- 5. Contact other homeless centers and food banks in your area to spread the word about the upcoming stand down to other homeless or at-risk veterans in the community.

SET... ASSEMBLING YOUR TEAM

6. After seeing what services your VA Medical Center can provide, contact local community health agencies so you can provide as many free services as possible:

Health Services – contact the community outreach program of a large local hospital, medical schools, and the local health department.

Vision Care – Not all veterans are eligible for vision benefits at the VAMC, so call eye care professionals in your area to see if anyone is willing to donate his or her time.

Dental Care – Contact a local college or university; many have dental programs with students who need to practice on a certain number of patients before they can graduate.

Social Security and Food Stamps – contact the respective local offices.

- The VA can offer information on VA benefits, substance abuse, and housing services.
- Invite your American Legion post to provide useful information, like how veterans can obtain a copy of their DD-214.

GO! DAY OF EVENT DETAILS

- 7. Be sure to have adequate signage onsite to make it easy for veterans to find you.
- 8. Prepare to serve lunch to the veterans. Ask a restaurant or caterer to donate food. One option is to bring a large grill and serve hamburgers or hot dogs.
- 9. Have Legion Family members volunteer at the event; they should have nametags and wear Legion Family attire if possible. It is recommended that Legionnaires volunteer at the stand down, as veterans often enjoy spending time with other veterans. Additional volunteers can include local JROTC units.
- 10. Put your public relations team to work! Download and submit the most current Stand Down Information Form at http://www.nchv.org/images/uploads/Stand_Down_Information_Form.pdf to be listed in their database of stand down events. Secure local newspaper, radio, and television media coverage to create community awareness and compassion for veteran homelessness. (Source: www.alaforveterans.org)
