Girls State ... Registration paperwork will be mailed to all units the first week in November. Registration will be Happy New Year! After being away for so long and having the office closed, we are getting back to normal here again. I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday and has a healthy 2014!

Girls State... The registration closes on February 1st and many Units have not sent in for a spot in this year's session of this writing. Keep in mind; girls get one chance in their lifetime to attend Girls State and if your Unit has sent girls from a particular high school for several years and all of a sudden stop, you will be disappointing girls that have been looking forward to this opportunity and will never have the chance again. Think carefully before giving up this very important program.

Following the close registration, over quota slots will be filled and then Units will be awarded extra slots even if they have not earned them based on their membership numbers per the Standing Rules. If your Unit has extra money and wants to send more girls to Girls State, send a check along with a completed form today!

Orientations...We are still waiting for Districts 1,5,7,9,11,12 & 17 to turn in their date request so a schedule can be put out. As soon as we have the information it will be posted on the web site and in the next Communiqué.

Corporation Renewals... are due beginning January 1 through May 2014. As soon as you file your renewal with the State, you must mail a copy of your report to Department for the Unit's file per the Department's Bylaws. If Department has renewed you Corporation and invoiced your Unit in the past do not assume we will automatically do it for you this year. You must request this from us if you want us to do so. The cost is \$62.50.

Dues . . . In the next couple of weeks each Unit will receive the form to report the correct dues amount for 2015 along with verifying the Unit's mailing address. The form will look the same as last year, as the amount of the Unit's dues is comprised of three (3) parts. National's portion, which is \$9.00, Department's portion, which is \$7.50, and the portion the Unit keeps. The three added together is what the member pays to the Unit. The form only wants you to list the portion the unit keeps.

If your Unit needs to make a change to the dues amount it must be voted on by the unit and appear in your governing documents. If the revised documents are not in our office, signed by the Department Constitution and Bylaws Chairman, by the date we have to report dues amounts to National, your Unit will not be able to raise the Units for the new year. It is very important to handle this immediately!

Test Units . . . There is a helpful tutorial on our web site under forms and guidebooks to show you step by step how to enter a new member and one on how to make labels.

General Membership... Do not tape or staple your checks or applications to your recaps.

Double-check your math before writing your checks. We are receiving a lot of recaps with checks written for the wrong amount.



Legislative News

Below is information I received from Paul Martel the Department Legislative Chairman for The American Legion. Paul received this information from a Legislative Assistant for Congressman Murphy.

I wanted to give an update on the omnibus appropriations bill's impact on veterans. Congressman Murphy voted for the bill last night when it was overwhelmingly passed with bipartisan support. The omnibus bill repeals some of the cuts to cost of living adjustments (COLAs) for disabled military retirees and survivors that were included in the Bipartisan Budget Agreement. At the same time, the bill increases funding to address the VA disability claims backlog. Committed to protecting our nation's veterans and the benefits they have earned through their service to our nation, Congressman Murphy has been pushing for legislation to eliminate all cuts to military retiree cost-of-living-adjustments (COLAs) included in the budget and has been leading efforts to prioritize reducing the VA backlog. While not fully resolving these pressing issues, this omnibus includes progress on both fronts and shows Congress' support for addressing these issues. The bill also includes additional funding for important veterans' programs including a \$218 million increase for TRICARE to ensure service members are not paying higher out-of-pocket costs for their health care, \$103 million in veteran suicide prevention programs, and \$270 million to expand employment services to transitioning service members, veterans with disabilities, and their spouses.

I would like to thank everyone who contacted their Congressman about this issue. I encourage you to send a note of thanks to your Congressman and especially to Congressman Murphy for their support on behalf of all veterans. If you would like the full report of the bill please email me at legislative@alafl.org I will email you the information.

I plan to attend the Washington D.C. conference (for more information go to the National Website and click on the link) scheduled for March 23-25th. I am looking for anyone who is going or interested in going who would like to share a room. The conference provides a great opportunity to learn more about some of the programs available for our veterans and their families, it provides an opportunity to meet with our Congressman up-close and personal and it is a great way to learn more about the legislative initiatives.

Keep up the letters, emails, phone calls and personal contacts. Together we can make a difference.

OPERATION GIVE A HUG

At any given time, more than 200,000 children have at least one parent deployed overseas. Having a parent deployed to a war zone for an uncertain amount of time is among the most stressful events a child can experience. Part of the military culture includes extended periods of times separated from our loved ones. Whether it is for deployment, schools, TDY assignments, unaccompanied tours or various other military responsibilities, military children are faced with numerous periods of separation from their loved ones.

Operation Give a Hug is a 501 (c)(3) charitable organization established in 2004 to held comfort military children by providing them with special dolls, often referred to by children as their daddy or mommy doll. Each doll provides a place to put the photo of the deployed parent and gives a child a tangible way of relating to that parent.



When Maddie's Dad deployed to the Middle East, Maddie got a "daddy doll". She had a way to hug her dad every day. This doll did everything with Maddie. He went to preschool; he even got a "no cavity" report at the dentist.
