

#### **Procedure for Obtaining Emblem Approval**

Those wishing to use the American Legion Auxiliary Emblem on merchandise of any king (i.e. t-shirts, jewelry, novelty items, etc.) must first send the request to the Department Secretary for her approval. This includes the Girls State Director and Chairmen. Each item must be identified.

The Department Secretary send the request with her signature indicating approval to the National Secretary and the letter of approval from the National Secretary, listing each item, is sent *directly to the manufacturer or company* that will place the emblem on the item(s). A copy of the National Secretary's letter of approval is sent to the Department Secretary and to the person requesting the use of the emblem if a name and address is provided.

Approval is a one-time approval and no re-orders can be made without going through the process again.

Please provide the following to receive approval.

- 1) A drawing of the item you want to place the emblem on showing where the emblem will be and what text will be around it.
- 2) The exact number of items being ordered.
- 3) The name, address and telephone number of the company or person making the items for you.
- 4) What your plans are for the items. (i.e. give to officers & chairmen or sell)

The National Office will not accept and requests for Emblem Approval that do not have the signature of the Department Secretary, so do not mail your requests to National.

Due to a last minute change in her schedule we were able to negotiate these dates to have a visit from her. With her desire to focus her visits on seeing, first hand, the work Departments are doing for homeless veterans we are proud to showcase our outstanding work through Homeless Veteran Director, Dorothy Walsh and George Taylor, Founder of National Veteran Homeless Support. Events are planned in the 12th, 6th and 16th Districts in an effort to give many of our members an opportunity to display their work with the homeless veterans as well as meet the National President.

A full literary of her visit has been mailed to every Unit and member of the Executive Committee as well as posted to our web site. Please make every effort to attend one of the events and show your support for our National President, Nancy Brown-Park.

**Girls State...** The deadline for numbered applications has come and gone and Department is still missing many applications. If your Unit has not returned its numbered application to Department you are at risk of losing your slot. Contact our office ASAP and make arrangements to get that application in immediately.

If your Unit is having a problem filling your spot, contact either your District GS Chairman or Headquarters and we will help find an alternate in your area to fill it.

Do not mail paper copies of the applications to Department. We will only accept the original cardstock application mailed to the Unit.

The packet material will be available no later than the second week of April on the Girls State web site girlsstate.alafl.org. Please notify your delegates and alternates to go to the site and pull the information off. They are to bring the material to the Orientation.

**Elections...** may be held not more than sixty days nor less than fifteen days prior to Department Convention per Article V, Sec. 6 of the Department Bylaws. This means your unit elections may not be held before April 14th or after May 29th.

I must remind you of rulings of the National Judge Advocate of The American Legion pertaining to elections. No condition can be placed on running for office. Any member in good standing can run for any office.

When asked if a dual member can hold office in both the Auxiliary and the Legion his response was; "No woman member of both a Legion Post and an Auxiliary Unit shall hold office at the same time in both organizations." Explaining it creates a conflict of interest because you cannot give 100% to two masters. If both organizations are aware of conflict and chose to elect knowing conflict exists it is their right to do so.

There are no absent-t ballots unless the unit's constitution & bylaws clearly outlines the parameters for allowing them.

The floor must be opened for nominations the night of elections unless the unit's constitution & bylaws clearly state it is closed prior to election night.

Elections must be held on a regular meeting night unless the unit's constitution & bylaws specify otherwise.

**IRS Update...** All Units should have 2012 990Ns filed. Copies of this report being accepted by the IRS must be on file at Department. If your Unit has not filed or is having trouble filing, it is the Unit's responsibility to contact the IRS at 877-829-5500. You must identify yourself as an officer of the Unit for someone to speak with you. WE CANNOT DO THIS FOR YOU!!! The IRS will not speak to me regarding problems in your Unit. I do not belong there and am not an officer of your Unit.

We have just recently been made aware of a new form required for EVERY enterprise with an EIN meaning all corporations, incorporated and non incorporated units and tax exempt organizations. Whenever there is a change of address or change in the person in charge, the new person in charge must now file the IRS Form 8822-B. This is a basic form that looks like a "Change of Address" form. What they really want to know is the NAME of the "RESPONSIBLE PARTY." This could be the Unit President or Treasurer, or however, has a level of control over the funds. This form must be filed by March 1, 2014 and then again within 60 of whenever your Responsible Party changes.

The Form 8822 –B and instructions are included in this mailing and on our web site.

**Corporation Renewals...** We must remind Units that you must renew your corporation through Sunbiz.org by May 1st or face a penalty. If you do not have the ability to renew online contact Department and we will be happy to do it for you and invoice the Unit. The cost to renew is \$61.25.

**Membership...** no member can transfer at this time without 2014 dues paid. If their 2014 dues are not paid they must pay the old Unit before they transfer.

A transfer is not a new member. Remember, if they have an ID # they go with renewals not new members. Out of state transfers are on a separate recap.

**Donations must be received by April 30th to be counted for the 2013-14 administrative year.** This goes for child welfare, Special Olympics as well as all the projects we raise money for. Any money received after the 30th will be reflected on next year's reports.

## Constitution & ByLaws

Previously in the Constitution & Bylaws Article some of the changes that were adopted during the 2013 American Legion Auxiliary National Convention in Houston, Texas were addressed.

The first change that was addressed was under membership eligibility. There is no change to the eligibility, but to the wording. The wording for eligibility currently uses "granddaughters, great-granddaughters, and grandmothers". This wording will be changed to "descendents". This means that the lineage of descendents goes on forever. Counsel General recommended the wording, which is how the Sons bylaws now read. According to a memo received from National Constitution & Bylaws Chairman, Kathy Dungan, The American Legion has not officially changed the wording for eligibility as yet.

Also, to date, a new Constitution & Bylaws template has not been created for Departments/Units to use. They are currently trying to get it drafted and put on the website and as soon as it is available all Departments will be notified.

That being said, I have talked to both Department President Gerrie Bailey and Department Secretary Robin Briere and we agree, that if it is not absolutely necessary to change your Unit's Constitution & Bylaws, to wait until National has made all the required changes. Necessary changes would be: – a change in the amount of Unit dues; a change in the date or time of the Unit meeting; a change in the name of the Unit (which requires a new Charter from Department), etc. When National has the new template for Department and Units, all Units will be required to make the changes at that time, and ample time will be allotted.

The following Units have not submitted an updated Constitution & Bylaws for several years. These Units should not wait.

- District 1 Edeker-Dubose (Jay) Unit 121 last updated 6/13/06 and the dues are listed as \$15.00 for Seniors and \$3.00 for Juniors
- District 2 Blountstown Unit 272 last updated 2/12/07 dues \$15.00 for Seniors and \$2.00 for Juniors
- District 7 Moultry Craft Unit 213 last updated 4/7/07 dues for Seniors is whited out and \$3.00 for Juniors
- District 13 Ft. Myers Shores Unit 351 last updated 4/25/07 dues are \$25 and \$5

Bonita Springs – Unit 388 – last updated 2/14/08 – dues - \$20.00 for Seniors and \$4.00 for Juniors



#### What's New

Responsible party. Beginning January 1, 2014, any entity with an EIN must file Form 8822-B to report the latest change to its responsible party. Form 8822-B must be filed within 60 days of the change. If the change in the Identity of your responsible party occurred before 2014, and you have not previously notified the IRS of the change, file Form 8822-B before March 1, 2014, reporting only the most recent change. Complete Form 8822-B as appropriate; use applicable boxes 8a through 9b to report any changes to the identity of your responsible party. See Responsible Party, later, for more information.

#### Purpose of Form

Use Form 8822-B to notify the Internal Revenue Service If you changed your business mailing address, your business location, or the identity of your responsible party. Also, any entities that change their address or Identity of their responsible party must file Form 8822-B, whether or not they are engaged in a trade or business. If you are a representative signing for the taxpayer, attach to Form 8822-B a copy of your power of attorney, Generally, it takes 4 to 6 weeks to process your address or responsible party change.

Future developments. Information about any future developments affecting Form 8822-B (such as legislation enacted after we release it) will be posted at www.irs.gov/form8822.

Changing both home and business addresses? Use Form 8822 to change your home address.

#### Tax-Exempt Organizations

Check the box If you are a tax-exempt organization. See Pub. 557, Tax-Exempt Status for Your Organization, for details.

#### **Addresses**

Be sure to include any apartment, room, or suite number in the space provided.

#### P.O. Box

Enter your box number instead of your street address only if your post office does not deliver mall to your street address.

#### Foreign Address

Follow the country's practice for entering the postal code. Please do not abbreviate the country name.

#### "In Care of" Address

If you receive your mail in care of a third party (such as an accountant or attorney), enter "C/O" followed by the third party's name and street address or P.O. box.

#### Responsible Party

Enter the full name (first name, middle initial, last name, if applicable) and SSN (social security number), ITIN (individual taxpayer Identification number), or EIN (employer identification number) of the old and new responsible party, as defined next.

Responsible party defined. For entities with shares or interests traded on a public exchange, or which are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission, "responsible party" is (a) the principal officer, if the business is a corporation, (b) a general partner, if a partnership, (c) the owner of an entity that is disregarded as separate from its owner (disregarded entities owned by a corporation enter the corporation's name and EIN), or (d) a grantor, owner, or trustor, if a trust.

For all other entities, "responsible party" is the person who has a level of control over, or entitlement to, the funds or assets in the entity that, as a practical matter, enables the individual, directly or indirectly, to control, manage, or direct the entity and the disposition of its funds and assets. The ability to fund the entity or the entitlement to the property of the entity alone, however, without any corresponding authority to control, manage, or direct the entity (such as in the case of a minor child beneficiary), does not cause the individual to be a responsible party.

If the responsible party is an alien individual with a previously assigned ITIN, enter the ITIN in the space provided and submit a copy of an official identifying document. If necessary, complete Form W-7, Application for IRS individual Taxpayer identification Number, to obtain an ITIN.

You must enter the responsible party's old and new SSN, ITIN, or EIN unless the only reason you obtained an EIN was to make an entity classification election (see Regulations sections 301.7701-1 through 301.7701-3) and you are a nonresident alien or other foreign entity with no effectively connected income from sources within the United States.

#### Signature

An officer, owner, general partner or LLC member manager, plan administrator, flduclary, or an authorized representative must sign. An officer is the president, vice president, treasurer, chief accounting officer, etc.



If you are a representative signing on behalf of the taxpayer, you must attach to Form 8822-B a copy of your power of attorney.

To do this, you can use Form 2848. The Internal Revenue Service will not complete an address or responsible party change from an "unauthorized" third party.

Privacy Act and Paperwork Reduction Act Notice. We ask for the information on this form to carry out the Internal Revenue laws of the United States. Our legal right to ask for Information is Internal Revenue Code sections 6001 and 6011, which require you to file a statement with us for any tax for which you are liable. Section 6109 requires that you provide your Identifying number on what you file. This is so we know who you are, and can process your form and other papers.

Generally, tax returns and return information are confidential, as required by section 6103. However, we may give the information to the Department of Justice and to other federal agencies, as provided by law. We may give it to cities, states, the District of Columbia, and U.S. commonwealths or possessions to carry out their tax laws. We may also disclose this information to other countries under a tax treaty, to federal and state agencies to enforce federal nontax criminal laws, or to federal law enforcement and intelligence agencies to combat terrorism.

If you are an entity with an EIN and your responsible party has changed, use of this form is mandatory. Otherwise, use of this form is voluntary. You will not be subject to penalties for failure to file this form. However, if you fail to provide the IRS with your current mailing address or the identity of your responsible party, you may not receive a notice of deficiency or a notice of demand for tax. Despite the failure to receive such notices, penalties and interest will continue to accrue on any tax deficiencies.

You are not required to provide the information requested on a form that is subject to the Paperwork Reduction Act unless the form displays a valid OMB control number. Books or records relating to a form or its instructions must be retained as long as their contents may become material in the administration of any Internal Revenue law.

The time needed to complete and file this form will vary depending on individual circumstances. The estimated average time is 18 minutes.


