FROM THE SECRETARY

Convention Registration . . . After close of Books on May 29, 2014, each Unit will receive their Convention Delegate Registration Form in the mail, along with the voting strength for the Unit. Do not wait for this form to elect your delegates to Convention. The number of delegates each Unit is allowed is based on membership paid. See Sec. 3, page 17 of the Unit Guide for information on how to figure your voting strength. Page 59 of the Unit Guide has a chart you can use. You will also receive notice of any outstanding accounts owed to Department. These must be settled prior to registering your delegation at convention. You will be able to take care of this at convention and I advise you to bring your payment to convention and don't risk it not being received in our office in time. We leave for convention on Wednesday, June 11th so our last mail run is June 10th. We realize you do not have thirty (30) days to settle your poppy proceeds due to the date of Convention, however, if you distributed poppies for Memorial Day, you must settle that account at Convention.

Remember, the Unit must register at one time, so please send the registration form and check with the first person to arrive at the Convention

Do not mail Convention Registration Paperwork to Department Headquarters. Registration is done at Convention only!

Officers' List . . . As soon as your Unit has its election, please complete and return the Unit Officers' List to our office. It is the Unit's responsibility to make sure the member is in good standing before electing them to office!

If your Unit held elections and was unable to fill any or all the offices, return the form to Department and following Convention the Unit will be contacted and assisted with filling these vacancies.

Poppies . . . we are not accepting any more orders for poppies until after July 1st for November distribution.

If your Unit has had a Poppy Distribution this year, make sure you remit the 25% to Department ASAP. These accounts must be closed by convention. If your Unit had a distribution, no matter where you got the poppies from, you owe Department 25% of the proceeds. If you purchased poppies from anywhere other than Department a receipt for that purchase must be included to claim as an expense.

Membership . . . As we try to reconcile our books with over & short I cannot stress enough the importance of units following these simple membership rules.

- Back dues require separate payment from current dues!
- Each year requires separate recap sheets!
- New & renewal require separate recaps sheets!
- Returned items **MUST** be place on a recap sheet when resubmitted!

These rules are not new and I am amazed at how many Units ignore them and submit membership without any regard for them.

Remember, any new membership received in Department before September 1st will be processed for the 2014 year even if the recap says it is for 2015. If you accept an application and money from a member and submit it to this office, it will be processed upon receipt, making them members for 2014. You are creating a legal liability if you accept an application and deposit their money and hold their application. An applicant has an expectation of acceptance once you accept their dues money and they are entitled to the rights and privileges of membership. Holding their application denies them those privileges.

We will begin to accept renewals immediately following Department Convention. Please continue to send in 2014 dues as we have not met our goal yet for the Department and we do not want to disappoint Department President Gerrie.

It is amazing that this year is coming to a close. It seems like just yesterday the ship was pulling out of port and now we are days away from disembarking at our Department Convention. This is my final message to all of you. I gave my notice a year ago and it is hard to believe the year has past and I am down to my final days. It has been an honor to serve the members of this great Department for the past 19 years with the last 10 as your Secretary. You have all taught me a lot and I will treasure the friendships I have made. Please give the new additions to your Department Staff the same support and encouragement you have given me over the years. I am confident you will all continue to do the wonderful work supporting the Mission of our great organization. May God bless you and thank you, from the bottom of my heart!

The office will be closed on May 26, 2014 in observance of Memorial Day.

We look forward to seeing all of you at Department Convention.

Dear Veteran Leader,

The 2014 Legislative Session has ended and the legislature passed a total of 264 bills out of 1812 filed this year. FDVA (Florida Department of Veterans Affairs) is proud to announce that all of the Department's 2014 legislative priorities were passed by the legislature as well as many other veteran friendly pieces of legislation. Of course these victories would not be possible without all the hard work of our Veteran's Service Organizations and the tireless efforts of our state's great veteran advocates. Attached to this email is the complete listing of all the veteran's legislation that passed the legislature this year.
