When this facility opened in 1957 the boys that resided there were orphans. Now they take boys who come from a troubled home life or displaying bad behavior in school and help them turn their lives around. These boys are on the threshold of becoming delinquents, they have to want to come to this facility. There are homes on the property with ten boys ranging in age from eight to eighteen residing in each home. Each home has "cottage parents". The ranch has horses and cattle and each boy has to work on the ranch. The ranch has its own school, gym and medical clinic. I was very impressed with this facility. Thank you 3rd District and District President Mary Christians for giving me the opportunity to visit the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch.

On September 25th I attended the groundbreaking for the Gainesville Fisher House located on the property of The Malcom Randall VA Hospital. It was exciting to be there at the beginning of my Department Presidents project. Thank you to all the Units who are purchasing bricks and pavers for the "Walk of Courage" that will be located at the Gainesville Fisher House. These bricks and pavers will be there forever displaying to all veterans and their families that The American Legion Family supports them.

The deceased list is important so that we remember those who served before and with us.


