PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Auxiliary Emergency Fund, established in 1969 from the estate of Auxiliary member Helen Colby Sall of Burlington, Wisconsin, has maintained a strong foundation for more than 5 decades. The Mission is to continue to build upon that foundation to support our fellow Auxiliary members in times of crisis or hardship.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Who is eligible?

- •American Legion Auxiliary members who have maintained membership for three consecutive years (current year and immediate past two years)
- •Applications for disaster assistance must be received within six months of a disaster event
- •One grant (disaster or hardship) per grantee will be awarded within a 12-month period

QUALIFYING EXPENSES

What DOES Qualify for AEF Funding:

- •**Primary Residence Damage:** Emergency assistance for primary residences devastated by disaster, including flood, hurricane, tornado, earthquake, fire, or other severe weather
- •Structural Repairs: Interior/exterior structure damage to vital livable portions of the primary structure (with photos as documentation)
- •Personal Property: Personal items, household contents, major appliances, furniture, and HVAC units
- •Emergency Expenses: Temporary shelter, temporary structure repairs, alternative power sources, and grocery replacement
- •Reimbursable Receipts: Itemized receipts for essential emergency expenses (must be dated from the day of disaster up to three weeks after)

What does NOT Qualify for AEF Funding:

- •Secondary or seasonal residences
- •Landscaping, fencing, accessory structures (pools, pool cages, patios, sunrooms, screened enclosures, lanais, decks, ramps, docks, boat garages, sheds, detached garages)
- •Individual personal electronics
- •Any expenses incurred before the disaster event
- •Expenses exceeding the three-week time limit

GRANT AMOUNTS

•National Grant: Up to \$3,000

National Disaster Grant: Up to \$3,000
Florida Disaster Grant: Up to \$1,200
Florida AEF Grant: Up to \$1,200

APPLICATION PROCESS

Before Applying:

- 1. Review and ensure you qualify for a grant
- 2. Carefully review the AEF frequently asked questions
- 3. Remember: Applications must be submitted within 6 months of the disaster

Application Steps:

- 1. Find applications on the Department website: www.ALAFL.ORG
- 2. Complete all sections of the applications
- 3. **Recommendation:** Print a copy and store with important documents for disaster preparedness
- 4. Provide required documentation:
 - •Photos of damage
 - •Full copies of receipts for itemized emergency expenses/repairs
 - •Driver's license (unless unavailable due to disaster)
 - •Other applicable documentation

STORM PREPAREDNESS GUIDE

Key Philosophy: Preparedness is the KEY!

The more insurance companies pay out, the more expensive our insurance becomes. It is our duty to protect ourselves and keep out-of-pocket cleanup costs as low as possible.

Year-Round Preparation

Reduce Your Belongings:

- •Purge belongings throughout the year
- •Donate gently used items to Amvets, Salvation Army
- •Give items to family members in non-storm-prone areas
- •Donate books to local libraries
- •Donate historic items to schools, churches, ALA Units
- •Check eBay prices for collectibles sell valuable items
- •Donate excess canned goods to food banks
- •Donate extra towels to homeless shelters or animal rescues

Home Security Measures

General Preparation:

- •Keep collapsed boxes on hand for evacuation
- •Purchase stackable plastic bins for storage
- •Consider purchasing storm shutters
- •Keep handyman contact information readily available
- •Schedule roof inspections before storm season
- •Purchase crank-operated weather radio
- •Store garbage cans in garage

Room-by-Room Preparation

Kitchen:

- •Store salvageable items in lower cabinets
- •Place perishable items in top cabinets
- •Do not replenish refrigerator/pantry before storms

Bedrooms and Living Spaces:

- •Pack lower cabinet items into plastic bins, place on countertops
- •Store important papers in waterproof bins or safe-deposit boxes
- •Place valuable clothing in plastic bins on top shelves
- •Unplug electronics, place on upper shelves, secure with plastic bags
- •If not flood-prone, place electronics in bathtub
- •Use washer, dryer, stove, microwave for small item storage
- •Store bedspreads in plastic bags on high shelves
- •Cover beds, sofas, chairs with blue tarps

Evacuation Procedures

If Leaving:

- •Turn off power
- •Post evacuation notice on door for power company and sheriff
- •Include contact information on notice
- •Keep important telephone numbers and address book with you
- •Fill vehicle with gas
- •Notify friends/family of your location
- •Fill bathtub with water for toilet flushing (if sewage system fails)

Insurance Considerations

- •Review Coverage: Check your current insurance policy
- •Purchase Flood Insurance: Most storm damage is from rising water, which homeowner's insurance doesn't cover
- •Note: Flood insurance can be purchased even if you're not in a flood zone

- •Collection cans and boxes in canteens with clever sayings
- •Monthly meeting collections with milestone celebrations
- •Garage sales and movie nights
- •50/50 raffles
- •Drink chip drawings for donors
- Special events
