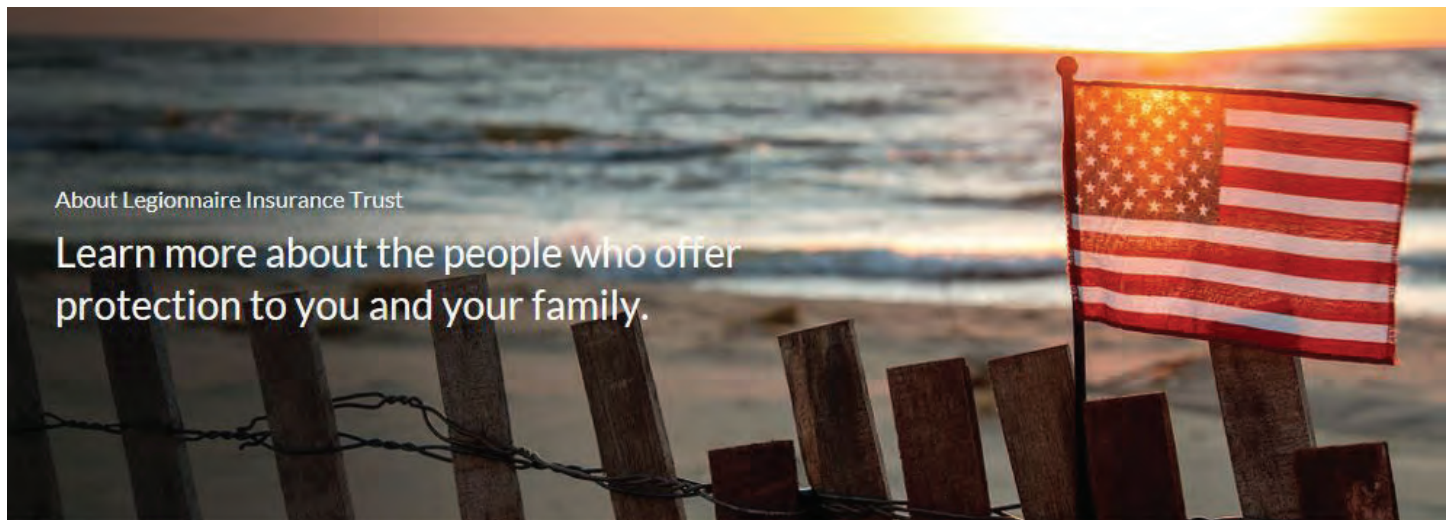

About

The American Legion, Department of Florida and the Florida Highway Patrol have teamed together to create the Youth Law Cadet Academy. This is a week long program that provides a hands on learning experience with insight into the operations of law enforcement agencies. The program allows these highly motivated young people the opportunity to consider law enforcement as a potential career choice.

Recruitment of high school students, both male and female, representing all communities and backgrounds in the state of Florida, is one of the main goals of this program. Once these young people have been selected to attend the program, the law enforcement community is challenged to present a program that will instill an understanding and respect for law enforcement professionals and their techniques.

During the program cadets will participate in the following activities:

- Exercises
- Sports
- Defense Tactics
- Driving course
- Firearms

ALL activities of the program will be supervised by certified personnel in that field.

Eligibility

- Florida high school student
- Male or female
- Between the ages 16 and 18, who have not reached the age of 19 by July 1, 2018
- Should be of good moral character and possess a desire to learn more about law enforcement as a profession
- Valid Driver's License
- Must have at least a 2.0 G.P.A
- High School Administration or Teachers should recommend students who meet these

Betty Youhona Barber passed away peacefully in Lakeland, Florida on August 7, 2018. She was born in the Central High Community near Alto, Texas on September 22, 1929, to the late William Thurman Rogers and Mary Evelyn Rogers. She was the oldest of six children in the family. Betty attended Rusk County schools and graduated from Central High School. She married Kenneth Howard Barber in 1960 and resided in Dallas, Texas. While in Dallas she worked for Braniff Airways. After the death of Kenneth in 1966, she worked for Fairchild Publications for many years.

Betty moved to Florida in 1987. She worked for the State of Florida, Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services/Children and Families for 7 years before retiring in 1994.

She became a member of the American Legion Auxiliary in Winter Haven Post 8 in 1987. Betty then became Unit 8 President, and served in almost every chairmanship in the Unit. In 2003-2004 Betty served as American Legion Auxiliary State President for the State of Florida. Betty received endorsement for National Executive Committee Woman in 2004. She was a lifetime member in the American Legion Auxiliary. Betty treasured her time in the Auxiliary and made many cherished friends there.

Betty also volunteered at the Friends of the Library for many years and the Regency Women's and Infant Hospital. She was an active member of the First Presbyterian Church in Winter Haven.

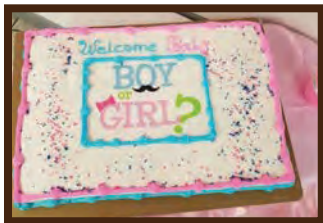
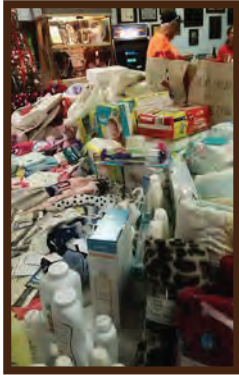

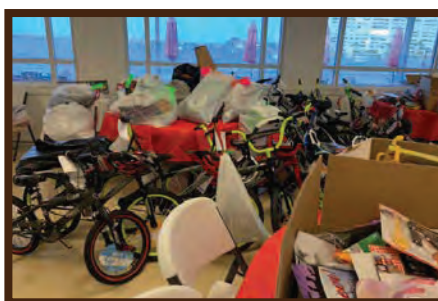
