
resident's Message TREVA KAY WILDRICK

HISTORIAN ELEANOR AMATO VISITS AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY USS TAMPA UNIT 5

During my recent visit to the American Legion USS Tampa Post 5 for the rededication and anniversary of the sinking of their name sake US Coast Guard Cutter Tampa, I had the privilege of a tour of the home for the American Legion Auxiliary Unit 5. I was taken back by the wall of honor of every president since the beginning of Unit 5 in 1921. Pictured above is President O. N. Bie (1921-1922) and on the right a sample of the "Wall of Honor".

President Bie led the charge to purchase the adjacent 2 acres of land in 1920. According to legion lore she couldn't stomach the notion of a homeless WWI veteran being buried in a pauper's grave. At the time, the cemetery was on the outskirts of town, but now it is near one of Tampa's busiest intersections.

The bone white tombstones march toward a line of oaks. This is sacred ground and is protected. Care of the cemetery falls to the American Legion Cemetery Corp. founded in the 70s. This truly is a site to see. Thank you Rosemary Hamblin for the great tour.




