

A little reminder note regarding membership. If you haven't paid your 2018 dues, you are now considered 'not in good standing'. If you are an officer, you could potentially lose your position. Thinking of raising your dues for 2019? Please make sure your Constitution & Bylaws and Standing Rules are updated to match. These will need to be current by the end of February, as we will be mailing your Unit Dues forms to update your information to National.

Fundraising is a large part of our activities. Without which we would not be able to support our Units, ALA Programs, Veterans, Communities and Charities. It is also a big responsibility and takes many volunteers to be successful. District Presidents cannot have fundraisers, however if a District works together with the Legion, the funds can be deposited and disbursed from the District Legion checking account. For example, if a District sponsors a Golf Tournament to raise funds for Boys and Girls State (or K9's for Warriors or Special Olympics or Project VetRelief - you get the idea) then the funds are collected and deposited in the District Legion account and proceeds are disbursed with a District Legion check from that account. The District President, District Commander and District SAL Commander should be communicating with each other throughout the event to ensure the success and "reporting" back to their members thereof. Through The American Legion Family we can make a substantial difference and have fun making memories!

Please remember if your Fundraising (T-Shirts, Calendars, Mugs etc.) involves the use of the ALA Logo or Name, either of which MUST be pre-authorized by National through Department. Now that the kids are back in school, make sure we don't lose any momentum in our quest of Catching Rays for Brighter Futures! Visit the school to see how they are coming on their essay contests. Be prepared to answer any questions that they may have.

Remember that your winners must be sent to me my April 1st, 2018. Organize a ceremony to award your winners. Serve food to the children and their parents. Prepare to send Thank You cards to the schools for their cooperation. Think about using an American Legion Auxiliary Certificate of Participation for the children.

Another opportunity, while visiting the school, would be to give them pocket flags to fold for your Unit. Explain the purpose of the flags and how they will be sent to our Active Military Troops. While you are there, you can teach our youth how to fold an American flag and the meanings of the thirteen folds. There are several booklets, coloring books etc. available for assistance to

teach the kids about our flag, The Constitution, and The Pledge of Allegiance. Flag etiquette, respect for the flag, and proper flag disposal could be discussed. Invite them to a flag retirement ceremony that your Post is holding. Attend their sporting events and show them how we stand for The National Anthem. Explain why it is important to show respect for our Country. Let them know that we support our Veterans and their families. Many of the children may have parents that are serving, or have served. Others do not, so they need to know the sacrifices our military have made for the many freedoms we have in this country.

The children of this country are our future. Without this wonderful organization of ours, they might not learn why it is important to be patriotic. Greeting from Department Headquarters!

Membership:

I am happy to report that as of January 17, 2018 we were 1156 members up from last year and first in the country. Way to go to all of you! And thank you for your hard work on membership!

At this time of year membership is coming in pretty fast and in large quantities. Department is working hard on staying current with the membership. At this time we are processing membership from two days ago. We ask that unless your membership is more than 10 days old from us receiving; please don't call to check if your membership has been processed. This delays the office staff as they have to stop and do research.

Also, please don't send a copy of the Veterans DD214 to us for membership. We only want the application with the recap sheet. When entering new members into ALAMIS, please note on the recap sheet that you have entered them and send the applications in with the recap sheet. This will save time and will expedite your new members being processed.

Girls State:

This year, the process for the delegates and alternates to register is being done on a new website. The paperwork that the delegates and alternates normally would bring with them to Girls State now will be uploaded to the website when they register. This will save time when loading onto the bus and checking in when they arrive in Tallahassee. You should have received or will be receiving your delegate and alternate cards at this time. The deadline for registration will be March 10, 2018. As the delegates and alternates register and complete all the process, Department will let the unit know.

Department Convention:

Department Convention dates have been moved to July 5 - 8, 2018.



HOW TO MAKE A PERSONAL CONNECTION TO GET MEMBERS TO RENEW

Step-by-Step Instructions:

Too often the only contact a member receives is her Dues Renewal Notice sent by the national headquarters office. Personal connection is necessary to help members become engaged in the American Legion Auxiliary.

Below are samples for how units can reach out and make a personal connection with their members and ask them to renew their membership:

• **Personal phone call** - Remind members why they joined the American Legion Auxiliary. Share the ways your unit has made a difference in the lives of veterans in your community, state and country. Encourage them to become a part of activities. Transportation may be an issue, so if your unit members can offer to provide a ride, this may be the key to increasing involvement. Offer to pick up their dues at a scheduled time.

• **Personal letter** -Send letters out to all of your members

at the beginning of the Auxiliary year. Outline the events on a calendar for all of the exciting things your unit is planning throughout the year and let members know that their membership is important to the mission of the organization. See sample letter.

Renewal Open House - Host an event at the beginning of the year where members can come renew their dues and mingle with other members. Encourage them to bring other family members along. These family members may be eligible for membership, but if not, remind them they are welcome to attend activities and that you do welcome their help in advancing the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary. Combine this event with your Legion family. It is a win-win for everyone.

- Plan a Member Day of Recognition Everyone needs a pat on the back or a "way to go." At your meetings, you can share information about a member's family history with the Auxiliary, what she is doing to advance the mission of the Auxiliary, her community service work, etc. Then share this information with your division Membership chairman so we can begin to share her accomplishments with the entire American Legion Auxiliary membership.
- Share your own personal experience as a member- Let your members know there will be ups and downs, but to always keep their eye on the big picture the mission of the Auxiliary not just personal rewards.







Our nation continues to be plagued by national disasters such as the catastrophic fires in California; your continued help is needed to assist our members in bringing a sense of normalcy to their lives. 

FL Dept. of Corporation Annual Report

Your Unit is required to be incorporated in the State of FL. Each year, you must file your annual report on line between January 1 and May 1. The cost is \$61.25 which can be paid on line or by printing out the return and mailing it with your Unit check. If you wish to receive a certificate, the cost is \$70.00. Please remember to send a copy of your filing to Department for their records.

The following instructions should help you with filing the report. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to email your questions to finance@alafl.org, cathiemcmullin@yahoo.com or call me at 610.715.2237.

Access <u>www.sunbiz.org</u>. Click on "Electronic Filing" on the left side of the screen. Click on "Annual Report Filing".

You will need the following to complete the report:

- 1. Your entity's **document number** issued by the state of FL. This can be found on your Annual Report filing notice or by searching the Division of Corporations' records at www.sunbiz.org.
- 2. Your entity's Federal Employer Identification number (FEI or FEIN or TIN)
- 3. A current list of your officers and their addresses.
- 4. A **valid email address** that is regularly monitored.
- 5. A major credit card, if paying online. Cost is \$61.25.

Please verify the information you submit for accuracy. The filing information will be added exactly as you enter it. Once you submit the information, it cannot be changed, removed, cancelled, or refunded.

Remember to send copies of all of your tax filings to Department Headquarters.

Supplies:

- Flat Rocks-I used river rocks from my garden
- Red, White and Blue paint
- Waterproof Mod Podge-Michaels craft store
- Flat edge paint brush
- Toothpicks
- Plain copy paper

Paint the red rectangle first. Let dry. Next paint the blue field in the left corner. Let dry. Use toothpicks to dot stars on blue field and to drag the stripes across the rock. Let dry. Coat of Mod podge to make waterproof. Print out a page of our website address and cut into squares. Use Mod Podge to adhere to back of rock and coat to make waterproof.

Below is information from Troopons, an organization based in Florida that distributes donated coupons to military families. Please read the information and follow the directions to ensure that the coupons your members have so lovingly cut and organized go to our military families as quickly as possible. There are other coupon sites such as ocpnet.org, but Troopons seems to provide the best and most recent information.

Troopons® Bagging Instructions

The commissaries have requested that Troopons be bagged and delivered to them as follows:

- 1. Cut out the coupons.
- 2. Sort coupons into two piles by status:
 - a. Expired. Not expired more than 2 months. (e.g. if today's date is 3/1/2013, you would cut out coupons with an expiration date that is not older than 1/1/2013.
 - b. Unexpired. At least two months of life left.
- 3. Sort each of those two piles into four piles by type:
 - a. Food items
 - b. Non-food items
 - c. Baby food/items
 - d. Pet items (like dog food)
- 4. Stuff them into plastic baggies.
- 5. Write the status (Expired or Unexpired) and the type (food, non-food, baby, or pet) on them.
- 6. Total the retail savings of the baggies and write it on them. This helps Troopons track the value of the overall program.
- 7. Mail coupons to:

Only "Manufacturer's Coupons" can be used. They can be from the newspaper, dispensers in grocery stores, tear-pads, and elsewhere as long as "Manufacturer's Coupon" is printed on them. No assistance vouchers. No food stamps. No store coupons. No restaurant coupons. No Internet coupons.


