With many volunteers from members, Meals on Wheels volunteers, and friends we sorted and distributed approximately 5400 pounds of non-perishable foods. Elisabeth Patierno, Kathy Kirkham, Judy Murdock, Laura Wine, Tina Brown, and many more helped organize and toss bad items and boxed for pickup.

Many including our Commander Robert Patierno, Bill Brown, Dennis, and Tanya Jones drove to assigned post offices to fill the vehicles and trailers to bring to the Legion.

May 13th, I received a call to come and haul more food from the Post office in Englewood, since they had many rolling carts full. Calls were made and we started all over again. We were told that approximately each cart weighs about 500 pounds of food. We calculated between Saturday and Monday we hauled, sorted, and passed out 5,400 pounds of food.

The organizations we helped are St. Maximillion in Punta Gorda, Jesus Loves Me Homeless

Coalition, Meals on Wheels, Foster Families in Charlotte County, and a local realtor that collected peanut butter & jelly, And many Veterans with food insecurities. We have plans to do it again next year. And will have more help sorting, picking up food, and distribution.
