Respect our Flag

As an American, as well as a member of the American Legion Auxiliary, each and every one of us should always show the highest level of respect to the most recognized emblem of our country - the United States flag. Those stars and stripes have endured through wars, terrorist attacks,

and natural disasters for well over 200 years. After the dust settles from tumultuous times, we look to those "broad stripes and bright stars" to give us a renewed sense of security and faith not only in our country, but also in ourselves. It should be obvious, then, that we always treat the flag with the utmost of respect. As written in the American Legion's "Ceremony for Disposal of Unserviceable Flags":

"A Flag may be a flimsy bit of printed gauze, or a beautiful banner of finest silk. Its intrinsic value may be trifling or great; but its real value is beyond price, for it is a precious symbol of all that we and our comrades have worked for and lived for, and died for a free Nation of free men, true to the faith of the past, devoted to the ideals and practice of Justice, Freedom and Democracy."

As our preamble states, "to participate in and contribute to the accomplishment of the aims and purposes of The American Legion", it is through our contribution that we must adhere to the Flag Code and ensuing resolutions to ensure that we continue to set the positive example of being a patriotic American. As written in Title 4, Chapter 1, Section 8(k), United States Code states:

"The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning"

This means that an unserviceable flag should never be reused or recycled in any way. Other organizations profess to using the stars from an unserviceable flag as a way to honor veterans. Yet this misguided notion is completely against everything that the Flag Code and the American Legion family have stood for in regards to proper flag etiquette. The blue canton is a representation of a living country and the flag, itself, a living thing, so it is only justified that it only be destroyed in a dignified way, such as in a ceremony honoring its service. As stated in a Facebook message put out by the ALA National Headquarters in September 2015, "The flag began as a whole; therefore, it is to be disposed of as a whole".

If someone comes to you and offers you a star in a little baggie, please do not accept it, but use the moment to kindly educate the person about Old Glory and how to show it proper respect. And if they say they are only trying to honor veterans, invite them into your Post home and show them the multitude of projects and programs that we do each and everyday that are a more fitting example of honoring our veterans.

Greetings ALAFL Bells in Service: I hope everyone had a blessed Thanksgiving and Christmas Holiday. Although the holidays can be stressful, the mission of community service continues. I am amazed by the dedication of our members to include our

Veterans, Active-Duty Military, and the community in their planning during the holidays. Members throughout the state of Florida volunteered to open the doors of their Post to host delicious meals for the veterans as well as the community. The generosity was well received and the veterans and community look forward to it annually. And, for that I say "THANK YOU"! Continue to ring your bell while working the mission. I see all that the auxiliary does in the community and I am blown away.

What's Happening Around Town:

Several Units sponsored Halloween parties in their communities; During Veterans Day units distributed poppies across the state of Florida; I hope everyone sent in their quotas; Unit 194 St. Augustine volunteered for Post 194's annual "Feed the Vets" Pre-Thanksgiving Meal serving over 200 veterans and spouses; Unit 65 Delray Beach donated Thanksgiving baskets to the Delray Beach Police Dept to distribute to families in need (great way to network within the community, and who better to know the needs of the residents in the community than the Police; prayer for Gods continuing to cover them); Unit 14 St. Petersburg, delivered over 500 toys to the Salvation Army of St. Peterburg/South Pinellas County for Christmas; Unit 401 Hillard supported the Town of Hillard Florida Parade of Trees, by donating a decorated tree; Unit 197 distributed flyers inviting the community to a Town Hall Insurance Education event (this was not a sales pitch event); Town & Country Memorial Unit 152 had a fundraiser for their Christmas Community Food Baskets giveaway; Unit 283 along with the SAL packed 33 Christmas bags of food for those in need; AL Family Post 351, Ft. Myers decorated and donated trees for those in need in their community; Unit 129, Jacksonville Beach participated in The Jacksonville Beach Deck the Chairs

annual event; several units sponsored Christmas parties for the kids in their community.Dept of Florida keep up the good work!

Fall Conference Recap:

Dept of Florida Fall Conference was held in November. It was good to see everyone and especially those who attended the Community Service Break-out Session. It was very informative and received good feedback. Thank you! Community Service committee member Liz Close, spoke about "How to Partner with Organizations" and how community service has been a major activity of the American Legion Auxiliary since 1926. We stand by our motto: Service not Self. While a person may not be eligible for Legion Family membership this does not them negate them from volunteering. She also spoke about networking with other community organizations who have the same mission of serving our veterans and the community. Invite them to a project/event you are planning. You might be surprised by the response of support outside of your post home. After Liz provided such good information, I had a hard act to follow and spoke about **American Legion Family Day (ALFD)**.

The National Executive Committee passed Resolution No. 7 in a regular meeting on October 12-13, 2022. It establishes that a special day known as "American Legion Family Day" be established and observed annually on the last Saturday of April. All American Legion posts throughout the nation should open their doors celebrating the great deeds and works of the American Legion Family. Start planning now! American Legion Family Day is fast approaching - - April 27, 2024. Our Rider family has a saying "for the cause not the applause," well this is a time to shine in the community. Each family is encouraged to participate and give a history of what their respective family has done over the years. Yes. brag! You deserve it. Picture poster boards are great for displaying all your Legion family achievements.. This day is also to educate the community on the **"Be the One"**

Be The One

The American Legion has a mission from the National level to the Post level to end veteran suicide and destigmatize the need to ask for mental help. That mission is **Be the One**. The program will destigmatize veterans asking for mental health support, provide peer to peer support and resources, and educate on how they can **Be the One**. Today, the No # 1 issue facing the veteran community is suicide (of course we know there are other issues our veterans deal with also) ... this statistic comes from the National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report. It is estimated that between 17 and 22 veterans or servicemembers take their lives each day. Think about that and the veterans in your own community. Our Veterans will continue to deal with post-traumatic stress disorder due to the Global War on Terrorism.

As auxiliary members our mission is to advocate for our veterans:

- Ask veterans in your life how they are doing...be it at home or our Post home
- Listen when a veteran needs to talk
- Reach out when a veteran is struggling

This and this alone is what Be the One is about; not being the one to pay your dues, or support a poker run it's about checking on our veterans and speaking up for them.

The power of Be the One

AL Posts have the power to foster unity and camaraderie and get support quickly to veterans in crisis.....and we all know a well-run auxiliary is the heartbeat of any AL Post. Work with your Post commander, SAL and Riders to plan a community veteran suicide prevention/ mental

health/PTSD outreach event to educate members and the community about the "Be the One" campaign and what resources are available. Display resources at your post or in your community.

Greetings from Neverland! Happy New Year! I hope each of you had a wonderful holiday!

Let me start by thanking President Dee for selecting me for the honor of working with our Juniors this year.

Tinkerbells across the state of Florida have been busy working the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary! From visiting Veterans in nursing homes delivering hand-made cards to helping Senior members with Unit and District events.

At Fall Conference, Juniors from all over the state came together to hold the first Department Juniors Meeting for the year. After their meeting, along with young SAL members, they worked on making beaded friendship bracelets. These bracelets were for a fundraiser to benefit the Department of Florida Juniors program. Thank you to all who donated the items needed to make the bracelets, as well as those who gave donations for a bracelet.

Lunchtime came and the Juniors had a special guest at their Pizza Party. National President Lisa Williamson came to join them to eat and participate in a special activity after lunch in honor of the Be The One initiative. Losing a loved one to suicide is heartbreaking, and sometimes difficult to understand, even more so when you are a child. That is why we took a unique approach to Be The One while discussing this sensitive topic with Juniors and Young SAL. "You can't be the one if you're not being the one for yourself." We kicked off the activity by explaining what affirmations are and providing examples. The Juniors were then given colorful index cards, crayons, colored pencils, markers, and pages of affirmations written for children. They were encouraged to write an affirmation that they thought applied to them on their index card. (many of them found more than one affirmation and made multiple cards!) The next step was to ask the Juniors to keep their cards, take them home and place them somewhere they could see them every day. They were told to read their card every morning when they woke up. While we didn't discuss being the one for a Veteran, we did talk about self-care and positive thinking, which is the first step in being able to Be The One.

Next month is the National Juniors Meeting for the Southern Division. It is being held February 3rd, 2024 in Nashville, TN. This meeting is being held in conjunction with Mission Training for Senior Auxiliary members.

Registration for the meeting will close on January 28th, 2024. I hope to see lots of Juniors representing the Department of Florida! Junior members who attend a National Juniors Meeting and are over the age of 14 are eligible to run for Honorary National Southern Division Junior Vice President for the next year.

Remember, it only takes one Junior to have an active Juniors program. And they can help with so many tasks. How are Juniors being included in plans for activities and events with your Unit and District? How are they helping work the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary? The Juniors Committee would love to see what Juniors are up to! - Always send complete information.
- Invite the editor and /or reporter to your event.
- Always be polite. Remember editors and reporters have deadlines so remember to thank them for their time.

Units build a relationship with your local hometown newspaper(s), they are always looking for positive community stories. Join/like/or follow community social media accounts (government, police, rotary club, neighborhood, chamber of commerce etc.). Make sure you like, comment, and engage with these community accounts. Be positive, and share who we are, what we do, and why we matter.

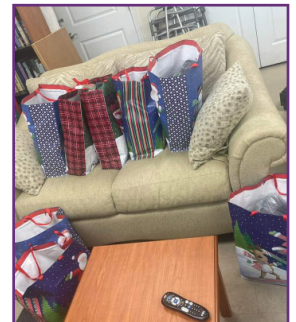
