Department Membership

MEMBERSHIP HELPFUL HINTS RENEWALS:

- Print legibly and include the membership ID when possible. This enables Department to make sure the proper member is paid.
- Transmittal number – this is a number that your unit/ membership chair generates, but it plays an important role in locating

a transmittal should you have a question regarding the transmittal at a future time.

- Indicate the check number on the transmittal. This also helps locate information if you have any questions regarding a transmittal.
- Please make sure that the last name on the recap sheet is the same last name in ALAMIS.
- Double check that the listed amount of members and amount due match and are correct. **If there are any discrepancies, the transmittal and check will be sent back for correction.**
- Double check if the member is a Junior or a Senior. A Junior member will become a Senior member January of the year the Junior would be 18.
- Double check that the members listed on the transmittal have not already paid for the year. **As no credit is being issued, the transmittal and check will be sent back.**

TRANSFERS:

- These cannot be processed at the unit level and must be sent to Department.
- Indicate whether this is an in-state or out-of-state transfer.
- A recap for transfers is required to be submitted. Please make sure to include a member data form for each transfer, including the unit number and state of their previous unit.
- A transfer may be a non-paying transfer, please be sure to indicate this on the recap sheet.

NEW MEMBERS:

- Please make sure this is an actual new member and is not already a member anywhere. If they are, they would be a rejoin; no matter how long its been or what state.
- If you have already entered the new member in ALAMIS, please indicate the membership ID on the recap/transmittal and there is no longer any need to send the membership applications or eligibility information to Department. The unit needs to keep this information on file for audit purposes.
- If you need Department to enter a new member into ALAMIS, please be sure that all pertinent information is filled in on the membership application. Member information and all eligibility information. If this is not completed, it will be sent back.

REJOINS:

- These cannot be processed at the unit level and must be sent to Department.
- If a member is rejoining, they will need to provide a new member application and eligibility information again to verify that their eligibility has not changed.

FULL ACCESS ALAMIS USERS:

- When you enter a new member, please allow 15-30 minutes for the member to show up as available to pay.
- Dept no longer requires that you send in new member applications/eligibility proof IF you have entered the member into ALAMIS yourself.

MISCELLANEOUS:

- No personal checks. All recaps must be accompanied by a Unit check.
- Do not use staples on any material sent to Department. We are scanning all documents and removing staples can tear the paper.



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Membership

Congratulations to the Department of Florida for being in first place nationally as of 12/20/2023 and we already made the 85% Department Award! This award is awarded to Departments reaching 85% of their 2024 Department membership goal by TAL Birthday, March 15, 2024. We are ahead of where we were last year in membership by 2264 members, and we have 49 Units that have already meet their 100% membership goal. I want to **THANK ALL OF YOU** for doing such a GREAT job so far this year on Membership.

The Next Goal Dates from Department:

85% of unit membership by February 1st, 2024, President Dee Bell's birthday. 95% of unit membership by April 1, 2024. April Fool's Day.

Our second notice from national was mailed on February 1 for the current membership year. Here are a few suggestions on how units can take the opportunity to let members know that they are the Auxiliary's most valuable asset.

HOW TO MAKE A PERSONAL CONNECTION TO GET MEMBERS TO RENEW: Too often the only contact a member receives is their Dues Renewal Notice sent by the national headquarters office. Personal connection is necessary to help members become engaged in the American Legion Auxiliary. Below are samples for how units can reach out and make a personal connection with their members and ask them to renew their membership:

- **Personal phone call** – Remind members why they joined the American Legion Auxiliary. Share the ways the unit has made a difference in the lives of veterans in your community, state, and country. Encourage them to become a part of activities.

Transportation may be an issue, so if your unit members can offer to provide a ride, this may be the key to increasing involvement. Offer to pick up their dues at a scheduled time.

- **Personal letter** – Send letters out to all unit members at the beginning of the Auxiliary year. Outline the events on a calendar for all the exciting things the unit is planning throughout the year and let members know that their membership is important to the mission of the organization.
- **Renewal Open House** – Host an event at the beginning of the year where members can come renew their dues and mingle with other members. Encourage them to bring other family members along. These family members may be eligible for membership, but if not, remind them they are welcome to attend activities and that you do welcome their help in advancing the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary. Combine this event with your Legion family. It is a win-win for everyone.
- **Celebrate Members** - Plan a Member Day of Recognition - Celebrate the unit's members. At the unit meetings, share information about a member's family history with the Auxiliary, what the member is doing to advance the mission of the Auxiliary, in the community, the member that might have their membership as the unit the longest. Celebrate Membership!
- **Share personal experience as a member**- Let members know there will be ups and downs, but to always keep their eye on the big picture – the mission of the Auxiliary – not just personal rewards.

Membership is everyone's responsibility. Go out and get those renewals – call those members who haven't paid – personal contact is the best way to reach your hand out and pull members back in.

Just **ASK** and keep *Ringin' In Membership!*

National Security

Happy 2024! I hope everyone has had a great start to the new year. I thank each and every one of you who continue to “ring those bells” and work the mission to support the emotional and social needs of active, reserve, and transitioning military servicemembers and their families along with Law Enforcement, Fire,

and First Responders. You are so very appreciated, and I am amazed at everything I have seen our units doing across the Department (troop boxes, partnering with Operation Homefront, Gold Star Mothers’ events, some very special projects, and more). I cannot wait to read about it all in your narratives this year. I love working and learning from you.

To begin with, we know that the National Security Program has many components. Throughout this year, I have been sharing different resources and programs that we can utilize and support through National Security via our Facebook Group, our monthly Zoom sessions (third Monday of every month), and more. Last month, there was a great webinar about National Security vs. VA & R from National. During that session, we learned what programs and different activities would be considered National Security and/or VA & R. For example, Wreaths Across America now falls under National Security, so please keep that in mind when you are completing your end of year reports. In addition, many other questions were addressed and answered during this webinar that may have been a bit of a surprise. I encourage you to learn more by visiting the alafl.org/programs/national-security/ and National Security page at legion-aux.org.

One program that falls under National Security are blood drives. The month of January is designated as National Blood Donor Month. Winter months are often times of reduced donations and blood shortages, so hosting a blood drive is extremely vital at this time. Oneblood.org is an organization that many of us utilize for blood drives (many members probably already are registered). You can contact a representative to coordinate a visit from the Big Red Bus to your Post. If you give blood, it falls under National Security, if you are assisting with the blood drive, it will fall under

Community Service. So, it is definitely a win-win. In addition, this is a great event for all Post Family to assist in coordinating and participating; you could even have a fundraiser going on with food or raffles to encourage everyone to come out to support.

Don’t forget...when looking for opportunities to support the National Security Program, always take a look at the upcoming calendar or events going on in your area. You never know when an opportunity presents itself (maybe you live close to a base that might be having an event where your Unit could provide some snacks, reintegration activities for our National Guard, or even host a dinner for military families in your area and more!) There are some fabulous chances for us to support the National Security mission in the upcoming months. I’ve listed some important dates below, but there are still many more.

So, before/ during/after your work did you...post on Social Media (with your hashtags, of course)...send in a newsletter article to the Liberty Bell?...count your hours? Send me pictures at nationalsecurity@alafl.org? Every moment counts, so please make sure and show us what you did.

Please do not forget about the Salute to Service Members Award. “Established in 2003, this award has evolved from honoring women veterans to honoring active duty women, to honoring all enlisted personnel who are currently serving our country in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard, Space Force and the National Guard/Reserve. One enlisted servicemember from each branch of service as well as the National Guard/Reserve will be recognized at the American Legion Auxiliary National Convention.

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Recipients will attend the National Convention as guests of the Auxiliary." All nominations are due by June 1st (to National), so now is the time to begin this process. Last year, National had less than ten nominations for the entire nation, so I would love to see Florida have a few nominations this year.

Next, deadlines are real! It's that time of year to start making a timeline of all your hard work for the year. Unit reports are due on April 1st. When reporting, please keep in mind that your volunteer hours are the most important thing to report! Your narrative should highlight each part of your program and what your Unit did to "be the one" and "ring the bells" for the National

Security Program. Take the time to share a favorite story about the positive impact you or someone in your unit had on our mission. Please include up to five digital pictures when submitting a report. The February Zoom will review reporting (with a very special guest to help us answer questions that you will have). If you have any questions at all, please let me know.

Finally, remember that I am here to support you. If you need something or have a question, please let me know. Please keep ringing those bells for our active, reserve, and transitioning military servicemembers and their families along with Law Enforcement, Fire, and First Responders. I look forward to hearing from you.

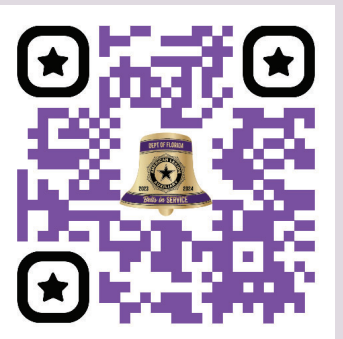

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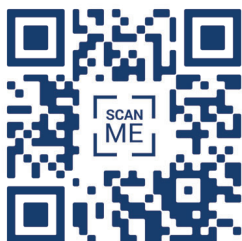
