Officers - Variety and Blooms:

- Bellflowers produce long-lasting, bell-shaped blossoms that can be found in rare blue hues.
- The trademark bell-shaped flowers consist of five petals fused at the base. Depending on the variety, these bells may face upward on little mats of foliage or dangle in drooping clusters.
- Their display of blooms is abundant, gracing your garden.

Sunlight: Most bellflowers thrive in full sun. Most members thrive when they are encouraged by other members to be involved in what we do. Members might bring in a new idea that might just be the sunlight that is needed for the next event to

be even better.

Soil: They need well-drained soil. Some alpine varieties even grow well in sharply drained soil and can thrive in rock walls or trough gardens. **Mentors are our soil**.

Be careful of the Invasive

Potential: Be cautious, as some campanula species spread not only by seed but also through underground rhizomes. Be careful of the drama, instead stay focused on the ALA mission!

If we don't continue to water our garden we won't grow.

Please don't hold Membership. Membership is year-round.

This is NOT a good practice and should NOT be done. If you're holding membership:

- Your growth percentages for your department will not be seen as an increase and won't be shown in the weekly updates
- If members don't have their cards, they may not be allowed access into Legions or visit other Posts.
- If they aren't a "registered member" they are probably not covered by insurance (God forbid they get hurt at your club or kitchen)
- 4. If you are holding their check; it

could only be good for 60 – 90 days depending on the banking institution, (Checks expire) their money will be no good and you will need to obtain another one from the member (which could also mess up the members' checkbook and balancing)

If a natural disaster occurs, you could lose all that valuable information and have no record or backup of it.

Please Do Not hold onto membership applications and money.

Don't forget about THE "Recruit 10" award for 2024. You need to recruit 10 NEW Senior and/or Junior members to qualify (see the Membership PAP for more details).

WHAT ARE AUXILIARY ADVOCATES

How to include non-members in your Unit Auxiliary Advocates are people not eligible for membership, but who would like to get involved in the Auxiliary. They should be welcomed with open arms because your unit can benefit immensely from their help, support, and enthusiasm.

- An advocate can attend a meeting but cannot make a motion or vote. They can however participate in discussion and contribute ideas.
- They cannot have a membership card.
- They should be thanked and recognized for their efforts i.e. certificate, thank you card

Who is can be an Auxiliary Advocate?

Why should they be included?

- Excellent spokespeople for our organization, your Post Family, and your Unit.
- Their volunteer hours, donations of time and/ or money can be recorded for the Auxiliary and reported on the year-end reports.
- They could provide a service, talent, or expertise that your Unit could benefit from.
- They may know someone who

is eligible to be a member of The Legion Family.

How can you recruit and involve Auxiliary Advocates?

- Encourage members to bring friends to volunteer events, fundraisers, bingo, etc., even if they are not eligible.
- Invite and incorporate young people into your Junior activities
- Promote volunteer opportunities and events in your local

community i.e. Unit/Post
