UNIT 62

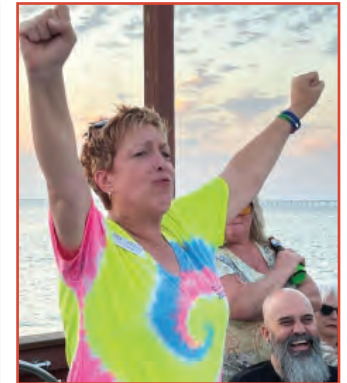
