Your 2023 membership goals are your membership at close of books plus 1. This year, President Jane has chosen a theme to "Continue Our Legacy Of Respect". Each District will have a theme from a Past Department President. They will be encouraged to use the theme but also use COLOR. While we focus on COLOR throughout the year, we will be Painting the Town for our Veterans!

On July 15th National sent out the first round of email reminders for Membership Renewal. Any member that has their email address associated with their information should have received this reminder. They have the opportunity to renew through National's website at www.legion-aux.org or through their local unit. The first set of paper mail reminders will be mailed out by National on September 15, 2022. Please start reaching out to our members now to renew early as target goal start before their membership expires.

Our Department Target Membership Dates are:

- 65% Target by POW/MIA Day - September 16, 2022
- 75% Target by Pearl Harbor Day - December 7, 2022
- 95% Target by Poppy Day - May 26, 2023
- 105% Target 15 days before Close of Books - May 31, 2023

The 2023 National Membership Recruitment Award is 10 Plus 3 in 2023. You will need to fill out the Entry Form found in the Membership Plan of Action or on Nationals Website. The award will be presented to members who recruit 10 NEW senior members and 3 NEW Junior members for the 2023 membership year. The deadline is June 1, 2023. The members MUST be entered and paid in ALAMIS by them. The Entry form MUST be received by National Headquarters by June 2, 2023. Only one entry per recruiter.

Department Membership Awards will be as follows:

- 100% membership ribbons for each District and Unit who Achieve 100% by Department's close of books. Goal for 100% is close of books plus ONE.
- 100% Pins will be presented to all District Presidents, District Membership Chairmen, Unit Presidents, and Unit Membership Chairmen who achieve 100% by May 31, 2023.
- A special gift will be presented to the Unit President and Membership Chairman, in each membership grouping, with the highest percentage received by Department and processed the week before Fall Conference.
- A special gift will be presented to the Unit President and Membership Chairman, in each membership grouping, with the highest percentage received by Department of processed the week before St. Patrick's Day, March 17, 2023.
- A plaque will be presented to all Units who reach 105% by May 31, 2023.

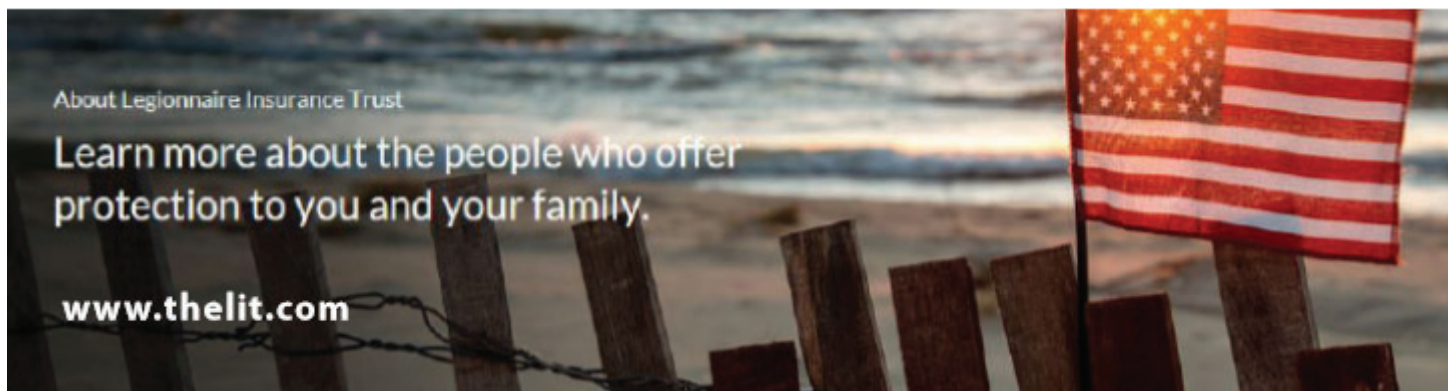

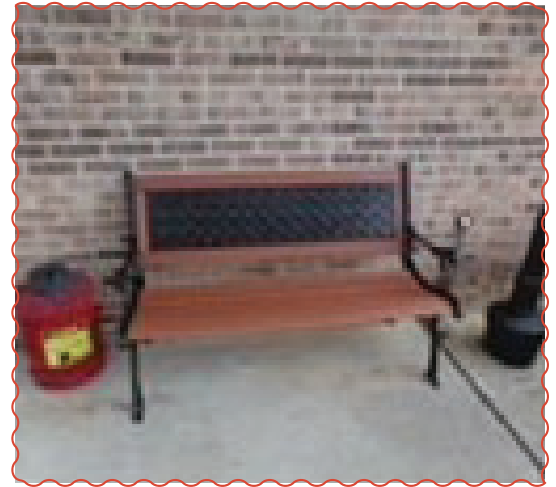

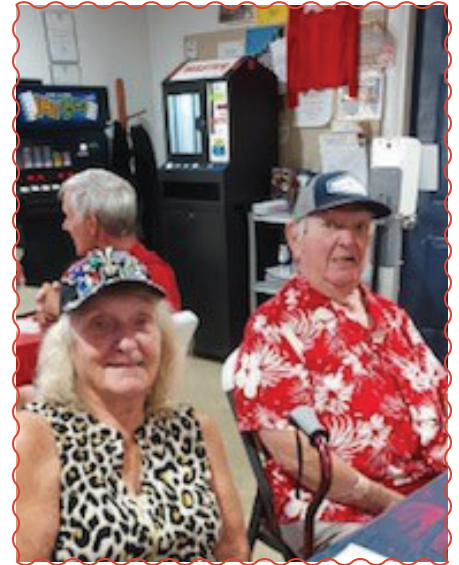
UNIT 291

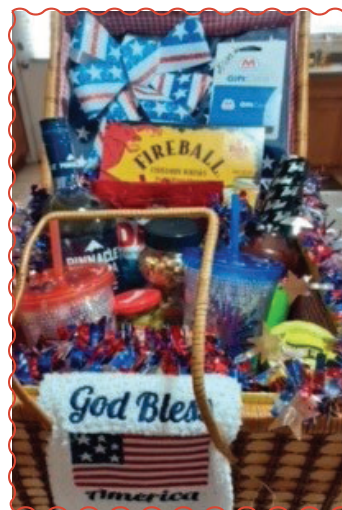
