I hope all is doing well. I just wanted to give you a little information that I received from my zoom meeting with National for this 1st quarter.

- AEF Grant Awards- 1st Quarter , Fiscal 2022-2023

- AEF Dollars Awarded:

\$137,610.35

- Total Members Awarded: 103
- Breakdown of Awards.
- Total Awarded Disaster Applications: 82 Amount \$110,460.74
- Total Awarded Temporary Assistance Applications: 21-Amount \$27,149.61

Dean Sanders also from our National staff was in attendance of the meeting. Dean is on the committee

that goes thru the grant applications and processes them. He shared that in FY2022 there were 89 grants for a total of \$119,439.05. But in FY2023 so far, we have granted more than we did in the entire prior year. We have had some devastating storms and disasters this Fiscal Year and that has affected the grant application needs.

We need to get out there and raise funds to replenish this fund so we are ready. If you have fund raiser coming up that you would like to get out, please let me know and I will be glad to help out.



UNIT 138


