The District Constitutional Conferences aka DCC are right around the corner and information will be sent to each Unit regarding voting strength.

At the DCC the members in attendance will be electing a District President and a delegate to National Convention. These elections are to be done by ballot if there is more than one (1) person nominated. I realize that it is customary in many Districts that the outgoing District President is the delegate to National Convention however if someone else is nominated you must have a ballot vote and the one with the highest number of votes is the delegate and the next highest is the alternate.

There seems to be some confusion about the expenses involved for a delegate to National Convention. All expenses associated with National Convention are the responsibility of the delegate; Department does not cover your expenses.

As a delegate to National Convention, you will receive a stipend of \$599.00 via ACH within two (2) weeks after the convention. In order to receive this stipend, you must attend all required meetings and must be in your seat at the given time. Failure to attend the required pre con meetings or arriving late to the actual convention will result in a forfeiture of some of the stipend .

If you are asked to be a Page at the National Convention you are responsible for all expenses and you will receive a stipend of \$500 via ACH within 2 weeks following the National Convention.

Happy Spring! School will be out soon!

As in the past, I have suggested projects that were low-cost, so that they could be quickly implemented with the most participation from Units. I have another easy project that I think

you will enjoy and that will make an impact on Florida's Child & Youth.

Graduations are rapidly approaching. With respect to our military children, there may be some students that will not have their parents attending graduation ceremonies because the parent is deployed. We can help fill that void with a little recognition of these deserving students.

Whether it may be Pre-K, elementary school, middle school or high school, I suggest that the Units create a certificate of achievement and present it to children who are graduating this season. Employ your usual contacts to get the names of children of deployed servicemembers: USO, military base personnel, duty station personnel, Armory personnel, recruitment

officers, Post service officers, school counsellors, church members, Boy Scout/Girl Scout leaders, JROTC leaders.

Next, create a certificate using the ALA emblem, encouraging words, patriotic/military icons and celebratory artwork. Or, use the standard certificate disc available from Emblem Sales. WORD has many samples and templates. If you keep the certificate generic, you will only have to fill in and change the student's name. Use cardstock paper for a quality presentation. It's available at the big box stores for a few dollars.

You may also have children and grandchildren of Post/Unit members that would appreciate such a gesture. Include these children when you are gathering names and preparing the certificates. Don't forget your scholarships recipients. I'm sure they will appreciate the recognition as well.

A graduation is a major milestone for our children and we should provide praise for their achievements and encourage them in their next level of education. This easy project can help us attain that goal.

know what they are doing, what they have done or what they have been working on? Remember this is our Future!!

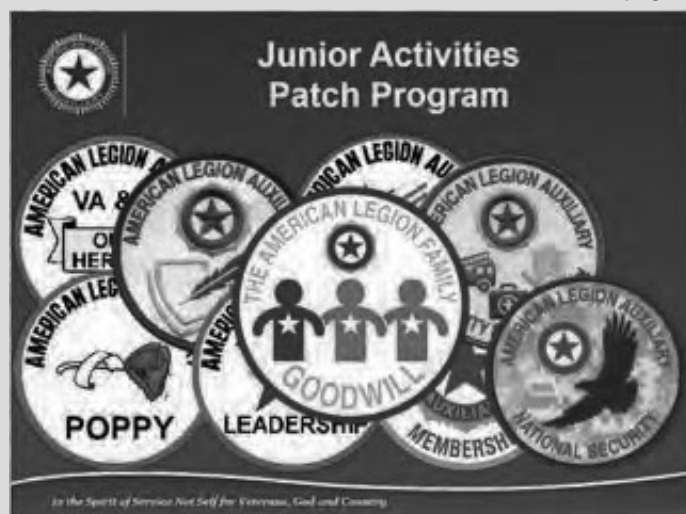
The ALA FL Juniors have been busy and doing great work for our Veterans, Military & their Families,

Every year we make a considerable donation to S.A.D.L.E.S. Ranch. This is a ranch devoted to helping Veterans and First Responders suffering from PTSD. Many of our members have donated time and volunteered for events at the ranch.

Community service conducted a clothing swap at our hall. Residents were asked to donate clothing and accessory items and then they were invited to return later in the day to "shop". No charge. The important part came at the end of the day. All items left over were donated to a good cause. What a great way to get donations, in addition to making members of our community very happy.

Our VA&R Committee goes above and beyond. Our chair lady has an open door policy at her house for drop offs. Many of the donated items go to a shelter for battered women and also to the homeless.

CONGRATULATIONS

DEPARTMENT FLORIDA! As of 03/15/2023 we have reached our 100% membership goal. We are currently at 100.45% to be exact! Not only that but we have 88 units and 5 districts that have also reached their 100% membership goal. You all are working so hard to reach out to our existing

members and recruit new members. You are spreading the word about our organization and what it can do for our Veterans. Thank you, thank you, thank you for painting the town for our veterans!

Don't forget about to "10 Plus 3" award for 2023. You need to recruit 10 new senior members and 3 new junior members to qualify (see the Membership PAP for more details).

We have already reached Nationals 85%, 95% and 100% goal. The next goal is 102% 30 days prior to National Convention, I know we can make that goal as well! Our next goal for the Units in Florida is 95% Target by Poppy Day May 26, 2023.

Our National Membership Chairman, Linda Tome, shared 10 tips for enrolling new members by designing a flyer and posting:

1. Make up a flyer advertising who you are and that they could be eligible to be a member in multiple places! Facebook page, at your Post bar, a grocery store, a restaurant, your gym, a daycare, your church, your Sr. Citizen's meeting room! Anyplace that potential members can see! (Remember to ask the establishment before you post a flyer!)
2. Change the way you phrase your request of becoming a member. Maybe use something like - Sign up now and receive a FREE gift (maybe a Unit Handbook or a red/white/blue pen or how about a package of Thank You notes). Research shows that people are attracted to the idea of getting something for FREE!!
3. Add a testimonial! Interview a new member or a "seasoned" member and take a quote from them and put on the flyer along with a picture (with their permission of course!).
4. Advise that signing up is easy and that you can help them with the paperwork (DD214 missing? you should

all know where to get them from).

5. Let them know that a portion of their membership dues will be used for veterans.
6. Have pictures of what your unit has done in the past - so that they will see how much fun you have!
7. Be sure to include your telephone number and an email address so they can contact you with questions!
8. Evoke emotion!! Our emotions are much better than our intellect at getting us to act! Use language and pictures that will evoke an emotional response.
9. Make sure that you include your Facebook page on your flyer -- or state: LIKE US ON FACEBOOK: American Legion Auxiliary Unit #9999.

Provide Obvious Value - you have to provide something of obvious value to your audience. Something that speaks to their needs and feelings. Again, add a picture and a caption of how your unit has helped veterans (be sure to get an ok to use pictures).

Poppies

As you gear up for Poppy distribution, please keep the following things in mind for next year regarding the Unit's supply of poppies:

- Poppy purchases are made through the American Legion Auxiliary Department of Florida Headquarters
- The poppy kits are assembled by Veterans
- Due to demand, poppy orders are first come, first serve
- Poppy orders must be received by Department no later than 90 days from your distribution date

Helpful Hints:

- Start planning your dates early in the year
- Your locations, etc. can be set later on
- Think about permanent dates for Unit distribution to help with timeframes
 - Approved dates are Poppy Day, Memorial Day, and Veterans Day
- Any non approved date(s) must be approved by the Department President by emailing president@alafl.org
- Poppy order forms can only include 1 distribution date on the order (Memorial Day and Veterans Day can not be combined on the same order)

New Information:

- Starting April 1, 2023 all poppy distributions must be on a poppy distribution request form, whether or not you are ordering poppies. There is a new form, which is located located on our website for distributions not requiring a purchase, called Poppy Distribution Form - Request Only
