The Public Relations Role: We take our role as a veteran's service organization seriously; It is important that we meet the needs of veterans and keep those needs front and center in the minds of the American public.

Public Relations is a support program for many American Legion Auxiliary programs, including Membership. To increase membership, it is essential to communicate who we are, what we do and why we matter to veterans and their families.

What is a Public Relations activity? Newspaper stories, television coverage, social media, flyers, radio, websites, online community calendars, events and newsletters are just some examples of public relations activities. Gather the" who," "what" "where" and "when" information from mission-related programs, such as Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation, Children and Youth, Community Service, Americanism, and Education. Telling the story behind the question "why" is very important in meeting the American Legion Auxiliary's goals.

When it comes to media relations, preparing media releases in Word documents that can easily be attached to emails as a best practice. Attaching photos separately, rather than embedding them into the Word document, also is recommended.

One of the ways that everyone can participate in the Public Relations program is through branding. An example of branding is "RED Shirt Friday" in which members wear red shirts with our ALA logo in support of our troops (as in Remember Everyone Deployed). I encourage everyone to wear the ALA logo when they are in their community, including when attending community meetings or events at your post.

Our Program Action plan for this year has a lot of great suggestions and tips on what members, units and districts can do. We are excited about our new chairman awards this year which includes social media, newsletter, and portfolio award categories. These will be presented to units in each membership grouping and district.

We encourage you to read through these documents, along with the End of the Year report, as they will help you "Ride the Waves" while you implement your annual Public Relations plan.
