Membership . . . All of sudden, units are under the impression that members of the Auxiliary must belong to the unit associated with the post of the veteran they are joining under. This is not true. The veteran can join the post of their choice and the female can join the unit of her choice. They do not have to be the same. They can be in different states if they so desire. I have no idea how this got started.

We seem to have a problem in several units with illegal membership. Uncles do not provide eligibility, father-in laws do not provide eligibility and SAL membership cannot provide eligibility. Remember it is the Unit's responsibility to verify an applicant is eligible according to Nationals rules. No Unit can waive the rules. If we continue to get complaints, the Department President will have no choice but call for a membership audit of your Unit. Clean up your house so Department doesn't have to.

What does Community Service look like in your neighborhood? Look around: Do you know if people are aware of available programs and resources that need volunteers within the community? This may take a little research for answers. A good place to start is

with your local officials. Send an email and ask what are the needs in your community and how can we be of help? Make sure we are branded when we serve the public.

Our goal has been to make our communities a better place for everyone to live. With all the natural disasters occurring in our communities, help to develop a disaster, emergency or evacuation plan, setting up first aid or CPR classes, or helping with a blood drive are just a few ways to engage your community.

New for 2021-2022 year, National President Kathy Daudistel's focus is "Caring for Those Who Care for Others," and we are going to recognize that special volunteer member with a Community Service Caregiver Award.

Do you have that one local unit member volunteer who goes above and beyond to help those in need?

Are they the first to spearhead a committee for the betterment of their community? Maybe they volunteer to take care of neighborhood members who aren't veterans but have mobility issues. They check on them to see what their needs are, prepare a meal for them, shop for them, or just spend time visiting with someone at risk. Let's recognize them for their efforts within the community. Encourage your members to report what they do for others. My unit 142 Pompano Beach puts out a spiral notebook at each meeting and members are encouraged to jot down what they do, how many hours did it take, and any money or inkind donations given.

Units may wish to award certificates to several unit members in the communities who are outstanding volunteers. Each unit may submit only one nomination to their Department Community Service chairman to be received by May 1, 2022. Our department is encouraged to recognize the member nominations from every Unit submitted. Each department Community Service Chairman will select one winner and it will be emailed to the national Community Service Chairman by June 1, 2022.

Girls State Information for 2022 Session

Remember you must have a minimum of 10 paid members and all unit quotas paid to department. Check with your treasurer that

these fees have been remitted into Department. Your Unit should have received the delegate registration forms for delegate and over-quota delegate. These forms must be into Department before January 31, 2022. Interested new Units should request an invoice along with registration paperwork from Department Headquarters

Now is the time to contact the schools to set up dates to interviews for your girl staters. Please don't interview any girl until you have the numbered application from department. If you interview before you have received your application because until you receive your application you aren't guaranteed a girls stater. If you don't have girls state in your Unit budget you need to have your Unit vote on these monies. Also don't promise any girl a slot for girls state. We don't want your Unit to be embarrassed if the program is, or you forget to mail in your monies to get a girls stater.

The Girls State session is being held June 7, 2022 through June 15, 2022. Help your girls stater get her online application uploaded to Department before April 4, 2022. They will not be excepted after the deadline. Just make sure your delegate isn't having any problem getting everything into department. There are a lot of the registration forms that have to be notarized and signed. They also need to attend an orientation, both the delegate and parent or guardian must attend. You can get the dates for all orientations around the

state from the department website. She may go to another districts if she has conflict with the date of her district. This is mandatory that they attend, if they don't their name will be removed from the girls state list of delegates to go. Orientations will be held starting April 2, 2022 through May 22, 2022. All orientations are held on a Saturday or Sunday during the month of April and part of May.

Familiarize yourself with the requirements for Girls State before you begin interviewing students. Please make sure the information you are giving your Units is correct. Our rules prohibit you from requiring citizenship for delegates. Who is eligible for Girls State, she must be a resident of the State of Florida. She must be in her junior year of high school and returning to her school for her senior year. She needs to possess, an interest in government, have strong leadership ability, good character and honesty, excellent scholastic standing, cooperativeness, community participation and service. Girls State delegates are a diverse group of women who share a common desire to learn.

Cell phone (386)-397-6966 or home (386)-755-3814. There are no dumb questions just the ones that don't get ask. I'm here to help each of you, we will have a successful girls state session. Please remember you are responsible for selecting your delegate, reminding them of the dates for registration, attending an orientation, and where they are getting on the bus on June 7, 2022. They shouldn't arrive at Florida State before 1:00pm. Check in is between 1:00pm – 3:00pm. Girls State is a GREAT program so lets send the best girls to represent your Unit.

medical appointments or arrange any form of health care for them.

Do you sometimes feel alone, isolated in your duties because no one around you does the same thing or understands.

Do you feel you do the care responsibilities for someone who served in the military because they are your spouse, son/daughter, sibling or other family member.

SERVICE TO VETERAN HOURS

Caregivers of family members can now be awarded "Service to Veterans" hours and earn hour bars "Caring for those who cared for us" providing that you do not receive professional compensation. If the caregiver lives with the veteran, they may be awarded 10 hours a week. If they do not live with the veteran relative, they may be awarded 5 hours a week. Please use the "Service to Veteran" hours worksheet to keep track of your hours.


