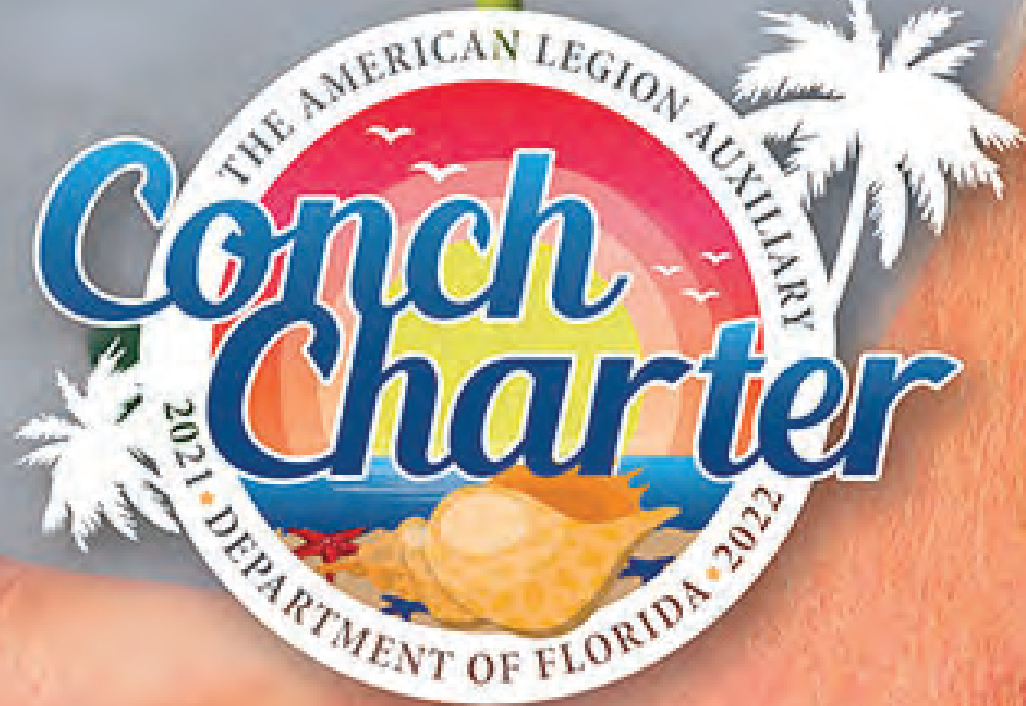

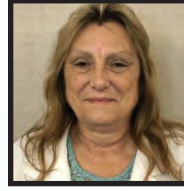

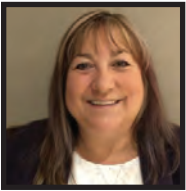

Rights & Responsibilities

Auxiliary membership has its privileges. With all of its rewards come rights and responsibilities --

As a member of the Auxiliary:

- You have the right to questions what do, how we do it and why, as well as the authority for doing what we do.
- You have the right to disagree in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order and the National Bylaws.
- You have the right to be heard during discussion, at meetings, in committees.
- You have the right to decide on issues, on projects, on expenditures, on candidates.
- You have the right to vote on motions, during elections, at meetings.
- You have the right to lead through a committee chairmanship, as an elected Officer, or an appointed Chairman.
- You have the right to represent you Auxiliary at District, Department, or National meetings or Conventions.
- You have the right to share the privilege of membership in the ALA with others that qualify.
- You have the right to fellowship with other Auxiliary members regardless of race, creed, religion or sexual orientation.

With every right there is a responsibility:

- You have the responsibility to be informed; you should acquaint yourself with our programs, goals, and accomplishments.
- You have the responsibility to be familiar with the National Bylaws, the object of the ALA and our Rituals.
- You have the responsibility to attend meetings; opportunities include local, District, Department and National meetings and their events.
- You have the responsibility to support fundraising efforts (by donating time, money or in-kind gifts as your Auxiliary and if possible, District and Department. This is how our Auxiliaries get the resources they need to help veterans and work all our Programs.
- You have the responsibility to lead; as an Officer or Program Chairman you must know and fulfill your duties.
- You have the responsibility to voice your opinion because your opinion is valued and may provide a new line of thinking and reasoning on an issue or event.
- You have the responsibility to pay dues on time.



Honor our military families: Frederick William Eggerking

Frederick William Eggerking was born in Hanover Germany in October of 1829. He immigrated to New York on December 2, 1848 at the age of 19. The following year he married Maria Dirks in Wurtsboro New York.

Sometime after, they moved to South Carolin, where in 1862 William enlisted in the Confederate Army and was assigned to the First Batallion Infantry, which ultimately became the 27th Regiment. He fought in numerous battles including Drewry's Bluff which stopped the Unions offensive against Richmond, Cold Harbor which was a part of the Overland Campaign which ultimately forced Robert E Lee to abandon much of Northern Virginia. First and Second Battle of Deep Bottom both Confederate victories to defend Richmond.

the last battle he fought in was the Petersburg Trencher. Both sides fought over 9 months in a series of trenches that was over 30 miles long. this lasted from March 1864 to April of 1865 when General Lee was forced to retreat and surrender on April 9, 1865. At the Appomattox Court House ending the Civil War.

During this battle was when my 2nd Great Grand Father was captured and taken to Point Lookout Prisoner of War Camp in Maryland. He was captured on February 20, 1865 and was released on June 2, 1865.

Point lookout was the largest and worst POW Camp. Established on August 1, 1863, it was located at the extreme tip of St. Marys County on the long low and barren peninsula where the Potomac River joins the Chesapeake Bay. Before the war, it had been a resort area with hotels, boarding houses, cottages and commercial establishments. In June 1862 it was leased to the Federal Government.

All prisoners lived in over crowded tents and shacks with no protection from the heat and coastal storms. Drinking water was scarce and polluted, eventually a boat was arranged to bring in fresh water. Food and firewood were both strictly rationed. Rats were a major source of protein for most inmates. Catching them became a favorite sport. Flooding of the camp was frequent, soaking the prisoners and their clothing and tents. There were also cases of the prison commandant and his subordinates reducing the quality or quantity of the prisoner's daily rations for their personal use.

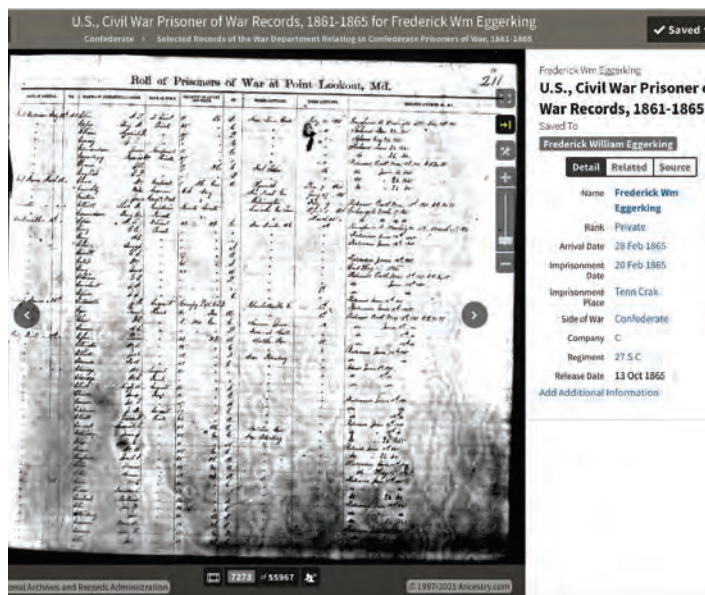
There was much animosity between the prisoners and the guards, who were mostly black troops. One Confederate soldier who managed to purchase his freedom from the prison reported that guards were offered by the officer of the day \$10 and \$15 a piece for every prisoner they could shoot in the discharge of their duty.

They were subject to extreme heat in the Summer and cold in the Winter. Due to inadequate food, clothing, fuel, housing and medical care, 3,000 prisoners died in a 22 month period. Besides chronic diarrhea, dysentery and typhoid fever became epidemic while smallpox, scurvy and the itch became quite common.

There were still 22,000 prisoners being held by the end of the war in April 1865, they were all eventually released or transferred by June 30, 1865.

It is estimated that a total of 52,264 prisoners both military and civilian were held there, even though the place was designed to hold only 10,000 people. 50 successful escapes happened during this time.

Frederick went back to his home in Charleston, South Carolina. He and his wife had one daughter on July 25, 1871. He became a naturalized citizen of the United States of America. Shortly after they moved back up to New York where they went on to have three more children. He passed away on May 27, 1915.

I hope that you all had a wonderful Holiday season and a very Poppy New Year. While Veteran's Day has passed and we still have time before our next 2 Poppy events, National Poppy Day and Memorial Day. Let's review some ways that you can keep those Poppies front

and center.

- Work with your Education chair and develop a school program that can include the Poppy.
- Have your Youth members create wreaths using their hand prints in some red paint
- Have your Youth members paint Poppies on small rockets to hide throughout the community.
- Carry small packets of poppy seeds to pass out with applications for membership.
- Consider working with a local artist that hosts "Paint and Sip" events to create a Poppy design that members and guests can paint and display in your home post or home.

- Create centerpieces or wreaths that can be used for your Legion family dinners. One example is to take a mason jar and fill it with Poppies and fairy lights. Tape the on/off switch to the lid of the mason jar for accessibility. Cut a piece of fabric to cover the mason jar lid and use a piece of ribbon to attach it the lid.
- Wear your Poppy pin often and carry small pocket cards with "In Flander's Field" on them. Remember to put your Units contact info on the back. Hand them a membership application at the same time.
- At membership rallies have the story of the Poppy present and speak of its history
- Share your events, ideas and pictures on the Department Poppy Facebook page at ALAFL Poppy
- Remember to have your Unit reports to your District Chairman by April 1st and District Chairman please have your reports to me no later April 15th.

Please know that you can request permission of the Department President if you wish to distribute Poppies on days other than those already defined. I look forward to seeing you all at Convention in June and reading your reports of your accomplishments.

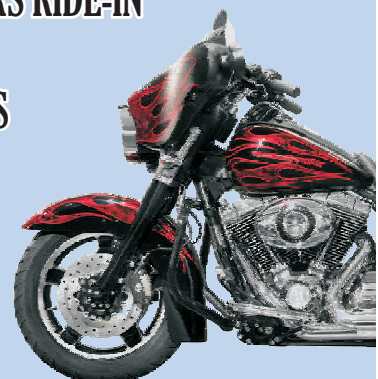

Happy New Year from the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Florida Staff!!!

This article is going to cover numerous items. Please share the information with the Unit members and Unit Chairmen.

Girls State

Delegate and Alternate Registration forms will be going out the first week of February. Please make sure that only one delegate/alternate receives one form. Please do not make copies and give them to numerous delegates/alternates. The forms are numbered for when they register. Each unit will receive one delegate form and one alternate form for each slot purchased. The Unit Girls State Chairman will need to check their email regularly as that is how Department will provide updates on registration. It is the unit's responsibility to make sure the delegates and alternates complete their registrations. Each delegate and alternate will need to attend an orientation. The orientation dates will be posted on our website under programs/girls state and on our calendar when Department receives them. The Girls State Registration deadline is April 4th. There will not be any extensions.

Membership

We have been receiving applications in Department where eligibility items have been written in when the unit or member can not check one of the appropriate boxes. Note that you cannot add anything. If you have a male who is wanting to join the Auxiliary, he can join if he is the spouse of a veteran. The brother, father, grandfather, or uncle of a Veteran can not join The American Legion Auxiliary. Also, stepchildren and great grandchildren are not allowed. If the Unit membership chairman or the bartenders have old applications, please provide new ones. The new application is located on our website at https://alafl.org/wp-content/uploads/ALA_Membership_Application_v09_24_2019_lp.pdf Unit membership chairman should be working with the Riders membership chairman to make sure that

Rider members have paid their auxiliary dues first.

Annual Corporation Status

Each Unit should be filing for the corporate status starting in January. Filing dates are January 1 to May 1. Once the Unit has filed their annual report please send a copy to The American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Florida. When District Presidents do their visits to the units this is one of the items they will be requesting to review.

Unit Elections

Unit elections shall be no more than ninety (90) days nor less than fifteen (15) days prior to the Department Convention. Unit officers list shall be sent to the Department Headquarters not less than ten (10) days prior to the Department Convention. Units must use the form furnished by Department Headquarters. Any member in good standing may run for any office.

District President and District Constitutional Conference

District Constitutional Conference shall be held annually but not necessarily in conjunction with the Constitutional Conference of The American Legion; not more than sixty (60) days prior nor less than ten (10) days prior to Department Convention.

No Unit shall endorse a candidate for District President who has not served as it's Unit President for at least six (6) months. A candidate who is not eligible for endorsement for District President may not campaign in advance of, or during, the District Constitutional Conference.

Units and Title 36

There was much discussion on Facebook in reference to Title 36 and The American Legion Auxiliary. It is recommended that if a Unit is trying to be exempted under Title 36 that the Unit does their research. The American Legion Auxiliary, National Headquarters

response on Title 36 is:

While The American Legion is chartered by Congress, The Auxiliary was organized by the Legion as an auxiliary veteran's service organization 501 (c) 19. The Auxiliary is not chartered by Congress.

It is the Units responsibility to confirm they are filing the correct paperwork with the correct government agencies.

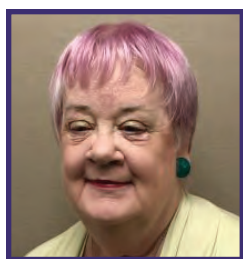

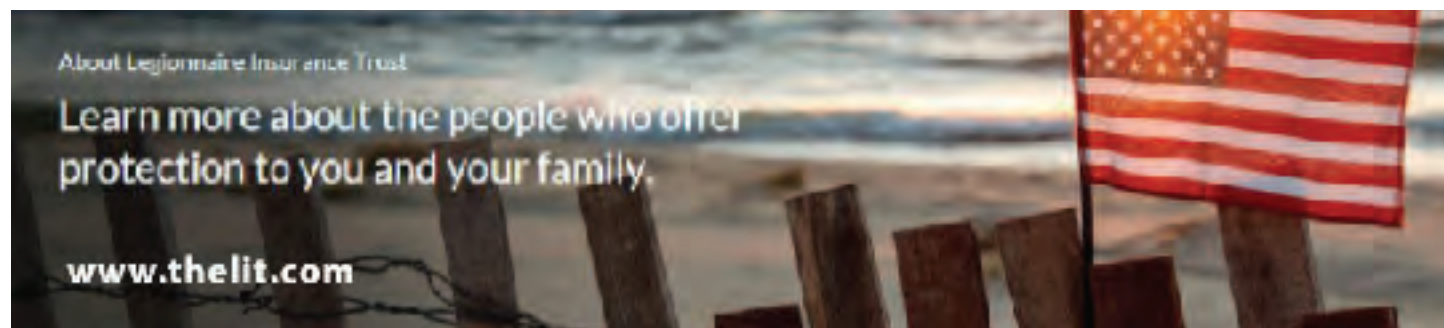
close on January 15. Now the Americanism Committee is moving forward focusing on the 2022 Americanism Essay Contest.

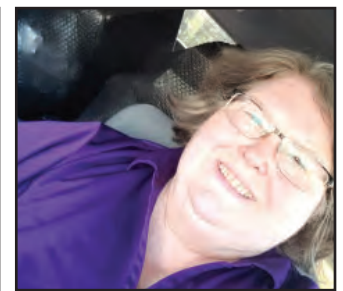
