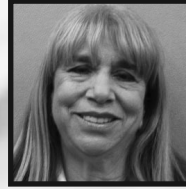

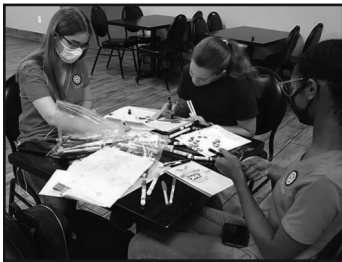


DISTRICT 5

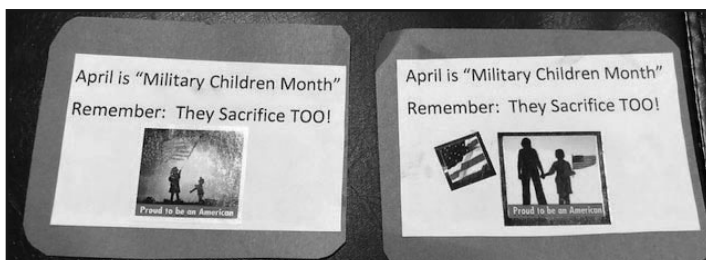
