This past year has proven to have its challenges for everyone. From zoom meetings, to drive by parades, curbside dinners, and virtual fundraisers. During these uncertain times, you have demonstrated how we as Auxiliary members, through our collective determination, can adapt and overcome, as we continued to carry out our mission of, Service Not Self.

As we finish celebrating our 100th Birthday, for a second year and as we move our organization into the next Century of service, more changes are ahead.

Some of you may recall, at the 2019 National Convention, the convention body passed several amendments to national committee structure changes, which was intended to streamline those committees and make them more efficient. This included eliminating Past Presidents Parley and Cavalcade of Memories committees altogether.

What does that mean for Unit Member of the Year and Servicemember of the Year? Unit Member of the Year will now fall under the Leadership Program and Servicemember of the Year will be part of the National Security Program. These changes will take effect immediately after the 2021 National Convention. You will see two resolutions at the Department Convention. Department of Florida members you will still need to vote to remove or keep these two programs.

Some great news regarding reporting... No Midyear Reports for the 2021-2022 Auxiliary year. That is correct No Midyear Reports!! Instead, National would like to hear from you the member. Tell how your Unit overcame some challenges or take pictures of your District working together as a Legion Family. Send in those "aha pictures" and stories and you may just see your Unit highlighted in the next Auxiliary Magazine. The American Legion Auxiliary National Unit Guidebook, (previously known as the "Poppy Book") has undergone several updates to provide important information for unit members. Although many small changes were made to help improve the guide,

primary changes included: updated membership eligibility, Legion Act, and inclusion of male spouses. Gender-neutral language



to be inclusive of our male spouse members. Icons highlight important information for the unit. The online version includes clickable links to referenced webpages or Facebook group pages.

The revised Unit Guidebook can be downloaded for free at www.ALAforVeterans.org in the MyAuxiliary member portal and is available for purchase from American Legion Flag & Emblem Sales.

Visit the ALA Academy at https://member.legion-aux.org/member/online-training for the latest updated training material. Live recorded sessions, Power Point Presentations, Department Leadership Conference and much more, the ALA Academy is a wealth of knowledge with 19 different topics of learning sessions.

National Convention is moving forward currently scheduled for Aug. 27-Sept.2, 2021 in Phoenix, AZ. The American Legion Family is focusing on creating a safe national convention experience for all who desire to attend. As part of that effort, there are many safety measures and protocols in place.

Attendees will be asked to adhere to COVID protocols including temperature checks, social distancing, and wearing of masks. Convention events are being planned as usual, at this time the only events being cancelled are the Parade and Band Contest. General Session is being planned to accommodate Delegates, Alternates, and guests registered with their department prior to arriving in Phoenix. The Commander's Banquet and States' dinner will have a limited number of tickets.

Speaking of the 2021 National Convention, the following proposed changes to the ALA Constitution & Bylaws will be voted on by delegates at the 2021 National Convention.

- 1. The first change is to establish the Executive Committee to the NEC in the bylaws.
- 2. The second change to vote on at National Convention is renaming the NEC to the National Board of Directors.
- 3. The third item of change to the bylaws is creating the position of Executive Director at National Headquarters, its duty, authority, and to whom the position is responsible.




COMMUNITY SERVICE JILL LUX



This less than in previous years but with all the setbacks and cancelling Girls State last year, we are pleased with the number of girls we are sending. Thank you to the Districts and Units that worked diligently to get our Delegates/Alternates. Also thank you to our District Girls State Chairman and Instructors for all that you have done to help the orientations run smoothly.

Girls State will definitely look a little different this year, but we are grateful that at least we can have it. We will still be able to hold it at Florida State University, with FSU COVID Guidelines in place. The first changes were that we are only allowed to have one girl per room instead of two as in times past. I want to thank everyone at Department of Fla. for their help during my 3 years as District 4 President, special thanks Madam President Ann King Smith.




DISTRICT 6 MARY LANGCE


