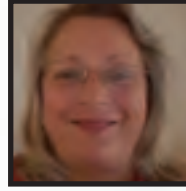

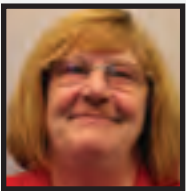

Can you believe it's fall already, I bet you're already working on ways to support our military service members and their families, lets go over a few ideas.

Supporting and Donating to the USO

The United Service Organizations has been lifting the spirits of service personnel since 1941, providing welfare, services, and fun activities for troops and their families (like live concerts for deployed soldiers). USO Treehouse specifically supports programs for the kids in military families, such as free Sesame Street Live performances — fun! If you speak to someone that has been coming and going from deployments they always found the USO's a great place for a cup of coffee and a snack as well as a making calls to home, finding internet access and a comfortable place to hang out during long airport delays. The concerts the USO sponsors during deployments were a welcome break from their daily duties.

As many of you know since the pandemic, the DOD had placed a "stop movement order" for our military. This also affected many programs of the USO, however, if there's a will there's a way, unfortunately most of the airport USO centers have been closed due to the Airports CDC recommendations plus the stop movement order. Volunteer opportunities are very limited, but if a military unit call on them for morale support, they will be off site to offer their services.

Donations are very much need this year, and I have even made a chairman's award for it, Oh yes I did, and here it is:

- USO Donation Support Award: A plaque will be presented to the unit in each membership grouping (1-6) that has made the highest contribution to the USO through the Department of Florida by March 31, 2021. If there are more

than one winner in the grouping, each unit will get a certificate instead. (suggestion is to send in odd dollar amounts)

- o Donations must be submitted to the Department of Florida on the Donation Remittance Form 2020-2021, for the USO (15060).
- o The contributions will be tallied up monthly by units, which is visible to everyone to view on the Contribution Form, Under Quicklinks on www.alafl.org. This is a new award this year

Supporting Programs with Operation Homefront

There are a few ways we can be active with some of the Operation Homefront Programs, and I know a few units and members already are.

- Coming up will be the "Meals for the Military" program that units can do as a grab and go events for either Thanksgiving or the Christmas dinners in your area for our Servicemembers & families.
- There will also be the "Holiday Toy Drive" through the partnership with the Dollar Tree stores around the state, starting up in mid-Nov. Customers of the store are encouraged to donate toys for military children, and once or twice before the drive is over someone (hint hint) will pick-up the toys and get them distributed. This program is designed to help and support Military families with children, and let's not forget the National Guard and Reserve families.

It is hard to believe that the summer is almost over! I know many of us have spent the entire spring and summer very close to home. Between the unbelievable weather our country is experiencing and the continued effects of COVID 19 restrictions, I am sure you join me in hoping that we can soon return to a somewhat "normal" life.

Staying close to home has other benefits: more time to work on our support of the American Legion Legislative Agenda.

In this article I want to address two things as we approach a very important time of the year- Elections and Communication.

American Legion Auxiliary and Elections:

The following is a guide for units as we approach

the November elections.

It is important for us to engage in the process, but there are limitations as to what we can do in the political arena. Our mission is to educate and inform our members and encourage them to exercise their right to vote. The American Legion Auxiliary is a non-partisan association and we may not donate money or resources to any candidate, nor may we endorse any candidate for office.

Therefore, the **American Legion Auxiliary CANNOT:**

- Make a campaign contribution to, or an expenditure for, any candidate.
- Neither can they endorse any candidate.

The **American Legion Auxiliary CAN:**

- Educate voters on the voting process.
- Provide information to our members about the voting process by helping voters determine where, when, and how to vote.
- Look up polling locations and describe to new voters what will happen at the polls.
- Organize Get-Out-the-Vote activities.
- Offer rides to the polls.
- Encourage and remind people to vote.
- Incorporate voting reminders into services and programs.
- Make the election visible by communicating within your Post and community.
- Volunteer at the polls.

Why should we pursue voter engagement?

- To advance the mission and values of our association.
- To increase voter turnout numbers,
- To get the American Legion Agenda in front of legislators and local leaders,

Communication:

The best way to have successful communication between our Department Legislative Committee and our districts/units is to make sure that we have your accurate information. Please email the legislative committee at legislative@alaf1.org with your information. You are the most vital link in the communications chain!

District Presidents - if you have not already provided me with you Legislative Chairman's name, please do so. I would like to have this information by the end of October so that I can set up a call with them and start to plan our first legislative webinar for the year.

Take Action Now:

Computers for Veterans and Students Act of 2020 or the COVS Act

This bill allows federal agencies to directly transfer surplus computers and related technology to refurbishers for eventual distribution to schools, veterans, seniors, and other specified populations in need. The General Services Administration (GSA) may also transfer property it receives from other agencies to refurbishers for such purposes. Currently, the GSA operates the Computers for Learning Program, which distributes surplus computers and related technology from federal agencies to schools and educational nonprofits; the program does not allow property to be transferred directly to refurbishers.

The American Legion proudly supports this legislation as it improves the quality of life for our veterans.

Since we are still celebrating the 100th Birthday of the American Legion Auxiliary, you still have time to complete the 100th Birthday Proclamation. This can be a goal of history for your unit this year. All you need to do is contact your local mayor, congressman's office and see if you can set up an appointment or attend a local city council meeting and have them sign the Proclamation. Sample wording for the Proclamation can be found under the Legislative Page on the ALA Department of Florida website.

Thank you to all our members for what you are doing for our veterans! Please remember to report your activities and track your hours as you support the American Legion Legislative Agenda.

I hope you will join me as we look forward together to a successful continuation year advocating for our military, veterans, families and communities!



First Coast Honor Flight Will Serve Northeast Florida Veterans

First Coast Honor Flight, Inc. (FCHF) is a recently created Hub in the nationwide Honor Flight Network, and the first to serve Northeast Florida Veterans.

Established in March 2020, FCHF will serve primarily Nassau, Duval, St Johns, Flagler, Putnam, Clay, Baker, Union, and Bradford counties, an area which is home to more than 169,000 Veterans. Priority will be given, in order, to seriously ill Veterans of any service era; World War II, Korean War, and Vietnam War Veterans; and Veterans with more recent service.

FCHF is planning its inaugural trip in April 2021 in anticipation of an improved public health situation allowing safe travel and the full, red-carpet Honor Flight experience. The Honor Flight group will travel roundtrip from Jacksonville International Airport to Baltimore-Washington International Airport in a single day, with metro D.C. travel via chartered motor coach. Our itinerary will include the World War II, Iwo Jima, Korean War, and Vietnam War Memorials, as well as front-row seats for the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington National Cemetery. Additional memorials may be added, as time allows.

Three things are necessary for a successful Honor Flight: **Veterans, Guardians, and Volunteers.**

- **Veterans** are the reason Honor Flight Network and all Honor Flight Hubs exist! Our sole mission is to provide elderly and ill Veterans an opportunity to visit the Washington, D.C. monuments and memorials which honor their service and sacrifice, and to experience again the

camaraderie of fellow Veterans during a day of recognition and remembrance.

- **Guardians** assist Veterans throughout the Honor Flight, and are privileged to hear firsthand the amazing stories and experiences shared by the Veterans during the trip.

- **Volunteers** make Honor Flights happen by helping prepare for and conduct events such as the pre-Flight orientation two to three weeks before the Honor Flight, departure and return ceremonies at the airport on Flight Day, and an emotion-packed Flight reunion a few weeks post-flight.

First Coast Honor Flight is seeking applications from Veterans, Guardians, and Volunteers for our inaugural flight in April 2021. 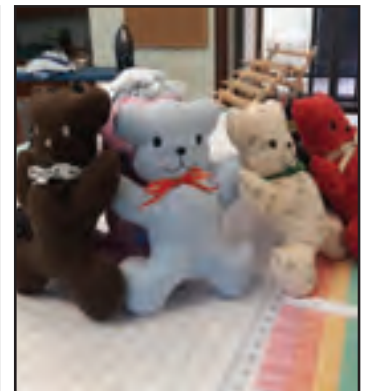
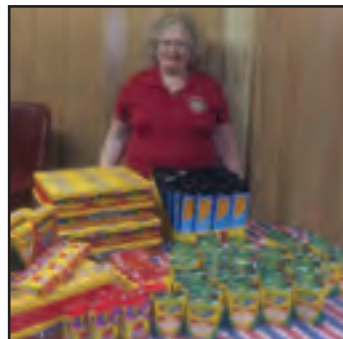
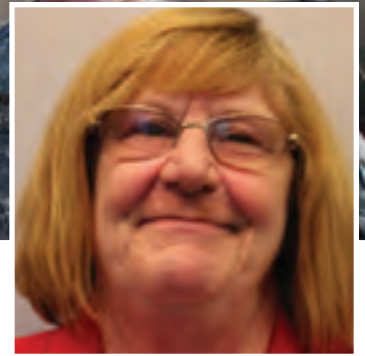

WOW ! In the words of Grateful Dead "What a Long Strange Trip it's Been"! This pretty much sums up the past six plus months. Nevertheless, with the beginning of the new Auxiliary Year, Auxiliary Members across the Nation are back at work, thinking of new ways to serve our Veterans, Military, and their Families. After all, as Auxiliary members it is what we have been doing for over 100 years!

During these past 6 months, National Headquarters has stayed hard at work, creating new ways to bring the learning to you.

Learning Opportunities:

Currently registration is now open for the **ALA Academy Live: Mission Delivery – Veteran Service!** This webinar is designed to provide you with resources to tailor your programs to meet the needs of the veterans in your community. You will also learn about opportunities to serve in VA facilities.

ALA Academy Live: Mission Delivery: Basic Training with 3 sessions open for registration –since they were almost full within hours of launch, National has expanded the capacity of the classes and will look at adding more sessions.

ALAMIS Training Videos: National has removed the old content from the current website and has been working on replacements, which will be posted late fall. Other membership sessions (lunch and learn, etc.) will proceed sometime in October.

ALA Foundation Grants: This course will showcase ALAF grants available to Units and Departments, explain grant process and provide inspiration by including actual grant recipients. This panel webinar will launch this fall.

ALA Junior Leadership (TBD): National has also been working on upgrading the ALA Academy operating system to make it more user friendly. They have already made a change so that courses launch in

a new tab in a browser vs. a window. The new version has some great-added enhancements. Many of the above courses will be recorded and then posted in the ALA Academy.

In addition to these great courses, National is developing a video series tentatively titled, **"Operating with Efficiency"** to include courses such as:

Governing Docs: This course focuses on identifying essential pieces to effective governing documents, including, why word choice matters. Presenters will also share what types of things go in each section, how to make changes to your written documents and how to keep record of the changes.

Running a Meeting: This course will not only focus on parliamentary procedures for running an effective meeting, discuss different types of motions and the correct ways to submit and process these motions, and venture into the new world of Electronic Meetings.

Effective Governing Boards: This course will cover topics on what makes an effective governing board. Discussion will include suggestions for how to form the board, number of members, types of people and skill sets, approval, removal, term lengths, and much more.

Members Rights/Due Process: Did you know every member of the ALA has "Members Rights?" Well, they do! Take this course to learn more about Members Rights, how to educate your members on their rights, and how to make sure your members and Unit/Dept. are protected.

Member Expectation Statement/Code of Conduct: This course will cover the benefits of having a written Member Expectation Statement (also called

a Member Code of Conduct/Behavior) AND walk you through the steps of creating a code, educating your members on the code, and holding members to the code.

Prevention versus Punishment: This course will focus on steps to take in order to address situations before they become problems. Let's focus on deepening our interpersonal relationships as opposed to looking for ways to punish and remove members. What are first steps to addressing a problem? How do you know if the behavior is just irritating or cause for concern? What are some mediation best practices to help resolve issue before they turn caustic? Can we create more opportunities for mission delivery if we spend less time dealing with "problems?"

These are all in the "this is a great idea!" stage so please be patient as National develops the course content and the facilitation plan to bring you the best quality product they can. For more information or to sign up for any of these classes please visit www.alafroveterans.org

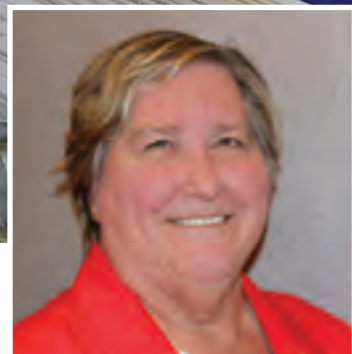

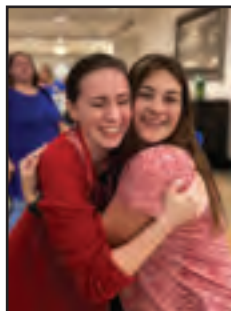
As COVID continues ... what happens to our Schools, our learning process, our socialization ability and Our Kids ...especially Our Junior Members?

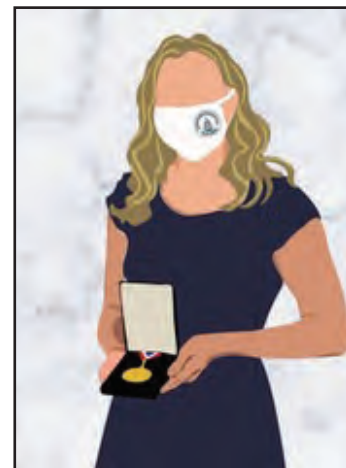
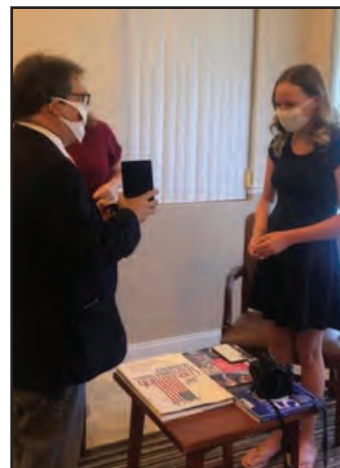

The 13 Ranking Motions – motions lower on the list cannot be made if anything higher is pending.

Fix the time to which to adjourn: This motion is used to set the time for another meeting to continue business of the session. It does not adjourn the present meeting or set a time for its adjournment.

Cannot interrupt the speaker, needs to be seconded, it is debatable and can be amended. Needs Majority vote.

Adjourn: This is a motion to close the meeting. **You cannot interrupt the speaker, needs to be seconded, not debatable and cannot be amended. Needs Majority vote.**

Recess: A short interruption which does not close the meeting. After recess, business resumes at exactly the point where it was interrupted. **You cannot interrupt the speaker, it is not debatable, needs to be seconded and it can be amended. Needs Majority vote.**

Raise a question of privilege: This device permits a request or a motion relating to the rights of either the assembly or an individual to interrupt business and, because of its urgency, be brought up for possible immediate consideration. **You can interrupt the speaker, does not need a second, it cannot be amended nor is it debatable. Needs No Vote.**

Call for the order of the day: By the use of this motion, a single member can require the assembly to follow the order of business or agenda, or to take up a special order that is now due to come up, unless two-thirds of the assembly wish to do otherwise. **Cannot interrupt the speaker, needs to be seconded, it is debatable and can be amended. Needs 2/3 vote.**

Lay on the table: This motion is used to place the pending motion aside when something of an urgent nature arises and needs the immediate attention of the assembly. **Cannot interrupt the speaker, needs to be seconded, it is debatable and can be amended, Needs majority vote.**

Previous question: This is simply a motion to end debate, allow no further subsidiary motions on the pending motion, and take a vote. It must be

seconded, no debate is allowed, and a 2/3 vote is needed to close debate.

You cannot interrupt the speaker, it does need to be seconded, it is not debatable, nor can it be amended. Needs 2/3 vote,

Limit or extend limits of debate: This motion can reduce or increase the number and length of speeches permitted or limit the length of debate on a specific question. **Cannot interrupt the speaker, it needs to be seconded, it is not debatable, it can be amended. Needs 2/3 vote.**

Postpone definitely: Should be used if the body needs more time to decide or if there is a time for consideration of the question that would be more convenient. The postponement cannot be beyond the next session in a group that meets regularly. **Cannot interrupt speaker, needs to be seconded, it is debatable and can be amended, Needs Majority vote.**

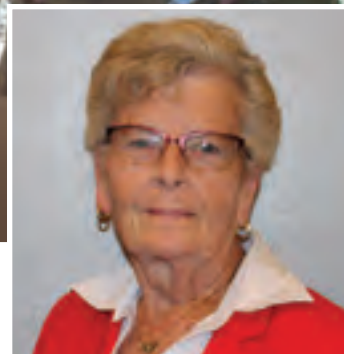
Commit or refer to a committee: This motion sends the main motion to a committee for further examination and refinement before the body votes on it. **Cannot interrupt speaker, needs to be seconded, it is debatable and can be amended. Needs Majority vote.**

Amend: The intent of this motion is to modify the pending motion before it is voted on. **Cannot interrupt speaker, needs to be seconded, can be debatable and can be amended. Needs Majority vote.**

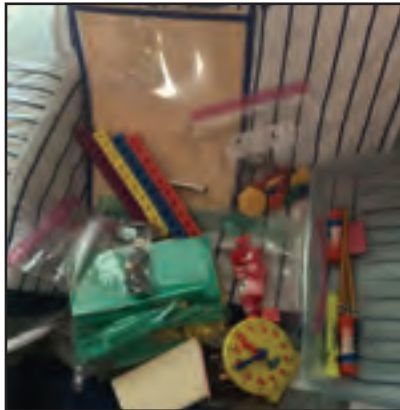
Postpone indefinitely: This motion, in effect, kills the main motion for the duration of the meeting without having to take a vote on it. **Cannot interrupt the speaker, needs to be seconded, can be debatable and amended. Needs Majority vote.**

Main motion: a formal proposal for consideration and action. **Cannot interrupt the speaker, needs to be seconded, it is debatable and can be amended. Needs Majority vote.**

District 12: Unit 200 installation August 10, 2020



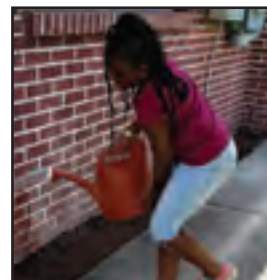
