


Honorary Department Junior Officers have Installation via Facebook Video

While COVID-19 has slowed us down, all units are still supporting their local schools, veterans hospitals and nursing homes.

I would like to introduce you to our District 8 Member of the Year of 2019/2020. Cookie Agan transferred to unit 325, Ellenton from Arizona in 2019. She asked if we participated in the girls state program. Unit 325 have never had a girl state chairman, so she was welcomed with open arms as our Chairman. Cookie wanted a unique way to raise money for Girls State so after researching ways to accomplish her goal, she decided to participate in Wreaths Across America. She contacted the cemetery that is a couple blocks away from Post 325, Mansion Memorial Park Cemetery in Ellenton, Florida. They were very interested in participating. She then contacted Wreaths across America and after much hard work, the cemetery was officially named the 101st Wreaths Across America site. She successfully raised enough money to place 450 wreaths in just six weeks. She organize the ceremony with the mayor of Palmetto, Shirley Groover Bryant and asked the sea cadets to assist. It was an amazing day. My confidence in today's youth has been restored. She raised enough money to send not one but two girls to girls state.

Cookie is eagerly working on the 2020 Wreaths Across America placement and ceremony. As of the date of this article she has sold nearly 800 wreaths and hopes to reach her goal of 1600 wreaths. Cooking is going to all District 8 events and sets up a table with information and raffles off a basket every time. She offers her help to any auxiliary unit who wants to make their local cemetery a Wreaths Across America cemetery. She even passes around a jar to collect change at every unit 325

meeting. You can see her all over the area spreading the word and asking for support, whether it is a government meeting, Kiwanis club or other local organizations. She has mailed out hundreds of letters to local businesses explaining the program and asking for donations.

This year of 2019/2020, Cookie is District 8 Americanism Chairman, unit Chaplain, unit Americanism Chairman, unit girls state chairman and unit public relations Chairman. She helps with every event the post and auxiliary has.

Cookie invited the two girls chosen last year for girls state to the unit 325 October meeting, along with their families to be presented certificates and a bouquet of flowers. Cookie submits to the local North River news weekly. She has a different Veteran from Mansion Memorial cemetery each week. She made a Wreaths Across America presentation to the city of Palmetto's City Council and was presented with a proclamation naming December 19, 2020 Wreaths Across America day in Palmetto. Cookie presented the proclamation to the president of ALA unit 325, Linda Legeer at the October membership meeting. I could go on and on about Cookies many attributes but I only have a page of this magazine. Oh, and she makes delicious cookies. Thank you Cookie Agan for all you do.



May 5, 2018 is a day Wilson (Will) Wareham will remember for the rest of his life. The former US Navy Seaman, a World War II veteran, had never been to Washington DC. The then 90 year old just assumed he never would travel there,

and that he would never see the incredible monument dedicated to the the sacrifice of the men and women he served with during the war. That was about to

change.

It started a few months earlier, as a short conversation with Will, who is my neighbor, where I learned that he had never traveled to the World War II monument. As photographer for Southwest Florida Honor Flight, I encouraged Will to fill out an application. Soon we were preparing Will's first trip to Washington D.C.

The day was a whirlwind of activity, an early morning departure out of Fort Myers, landing in Washington D.C. to a water cannon salute as the aircraft taxied to the gate, and visiting the WWII Memorial, Vietnam Veterans Memorial, Korean War Veterans Memorial, Vietnam Woman's Memorial, the Women In Military Service For America Memorial, the United States Marine Corps War Memorial (Iwo Jima Memorial), and of course, Arlington National Cemetery to see the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the

Unknown Solider.

Will's guardian, Bonnie Rorh, helped Will throughout the day, as he enjoyed seeing our nation's capital, and the monuments for the first time. The highlight of the day for Will, of course, was the World War II monument. Upon our arrival at the plaza, it was like stepping back in time, volunteers dressed in WWII era clothes were there to greet the veterans, nurses giving kisses to the vets, and dancing to the wonderful music of that time. To top off the day, Will got to meet and be photographed with former senator Bob Dole! As we flew home, the vets had "Mail Call" receiving letters and cards from their families and from kids in the local schools. And finally, a late-night Welcome Home, greeted by hundreds of members of the community,


bagpipers, and color guards from many organizations. Quite an emotional day for sure.
