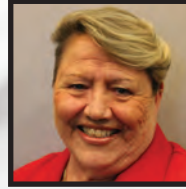

IT TAKES A FORCE

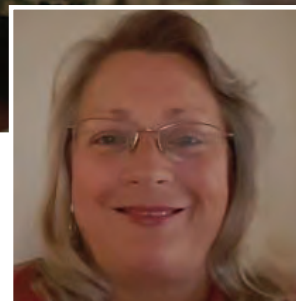
Their journey is everyone's responsibility. From the moment they enlist, through their assignments and deployments, and as they transition back to their communities, they can rely on our support.

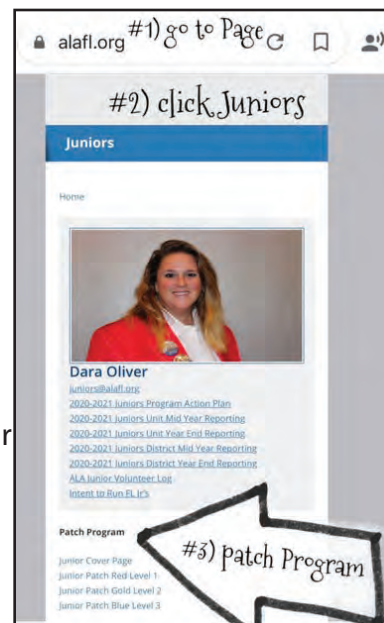

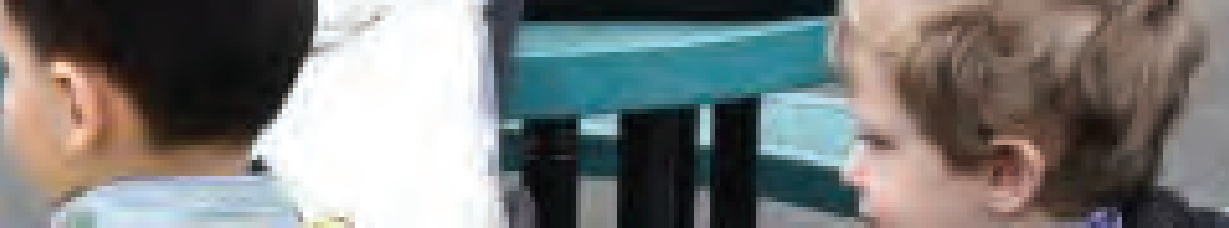

It's easy and all the paperwork for the 3 different age groups (Red – Level 1 = K – 3rd grade, Gold – Level 2 = 4th – 8th Grade & Blue - Level 3 = 9 – 12th Grade) is on our Department Website at www.alaf1.org under Patch Program and is printable. It's easy to find and navigate.



The ALA recently hosted Mentor Training for Juniors via a Webinar and many members from around the nation took advantage of it. The important highlights were: let your Juniors within the Auxiliary: engage them, be active and mentor them. Allow the Junior members to assist you in whatever

Enjoy the Holidays whatever way you can and Remember to Be Kind always ... We may not be in the same boat, but we are in the same storm.

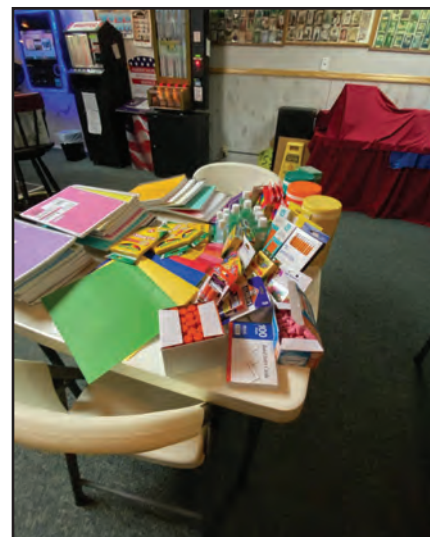
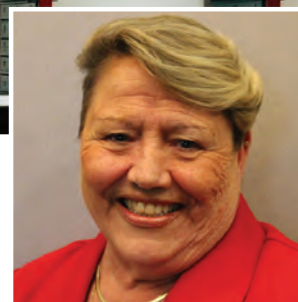

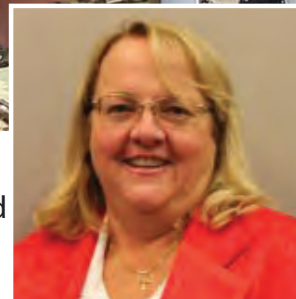

SOUTHEAST FLORIDA HONOR FLIGHT & POW-MIA-OREE HOSTING SPORTING CLAYS FUNDRAISER

Southeast Florida Honor Flight and POW-MIA-OREE are partnering to host Pull! For Our Veterans Sporting Clays Tournament on February 27, 2021 at the South Florida Shooting Club in Palm City, FL. Sponsorships and shooter support for this event will help raise funds for both organizations to honor veterans. Southeast Florida Honor Flight pays tribute to living WWII, Korean & Vietnam War veterans by flying them to their memorials in Washington, DC, while POW-MIA-OREE remembers veterans who have passed by marking their gravestones with a special coin and a live reading.

We encourage you to sign up today or share the event details with shooter friends! The South Florida Shooting Club Sporting Clays course is a gorgeous property. Many levels of sponsorship are available for this outdoor event.

The tournament will begin at 8:00AM at 500 SW Long Drive, Palm City, with a light breakfast and registration. There will be a safety briefing at 8:45AM and a shotgun start at 9:00AM. BBQ lunch, raffles,



silent auction and awards to follow.

The Sporting Clays Tournament is currently open to shooter registration and sponsorships which can both be found at www.honorflightsefl.org/events. Teams or individual shooters can register now through January 15th at the cost of \$150 per shooter. After January 15th, the entry fee will be \$175 per shooter. Shooter registration includes: light breakfast, BBQ lunch, ammo, targets, cart per four-person team and ear protection. Shotguns are available for rent at the club. First 75 registrants will receive a goody bag.

Southeast Florida Honor Flight's mission is to fly local WWII, Korean & Vietnam War veterans to Washington, DC to visit the memorials built to honor their service and sacrifices. An Honor Flight is a day honoring local veterans with the appreciation, honor





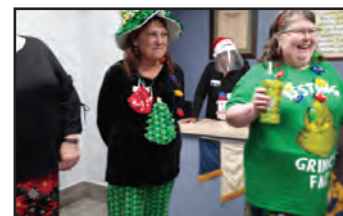
and welcome home most never received. Southeast Florida Honor Flight is a 501c3, 100% volunteer organization based in Stuart, FL, serving Indian River, St. Lucie, Martin, Palm Beach and Okeechobee counties. All funds raised go to supporting four Honor Flights per year and to ensure that every veteran flies absolutely free of charge.

The mission of the POW-MIA-OREE is to show respect to veterans and their families, for the sacrifices made supporting the American way of life. POW-MIA-OREE annually live reads the names of the veterans interred in our National Cemeteries and places a Custom Challenge Coin on the headstones of those interred for their families (as a keepsake) in support of National POW-MIA Remembrance Day because "No Soldier Should Ever Be Forgotten". POW-MIA-OREE, Corp. is a registered 501c3 organization based in Palm Beach, FL, that covers most of the National

Cemeteries in the state of Florida, with eyes on covering the nation. All funds raised support the annual live reading service events and the growth of the program to every National Cemetery, with the goal that one day, "No Soldier Will Ever Be Forgotten".

Both organizations are eager to get back to honoring veterans after their 2020 and Spring 2021 events were cancelled due to the Covid-19 virus. The next scheduled Honor Flights for Southeast Florida Honor Flight out of PBI will be in the Fall of 2021—dates to be determined. The next scheduled POW-MIA-OREE event is scheduled for September 11, 2021 at the South Florida National Cemetery.

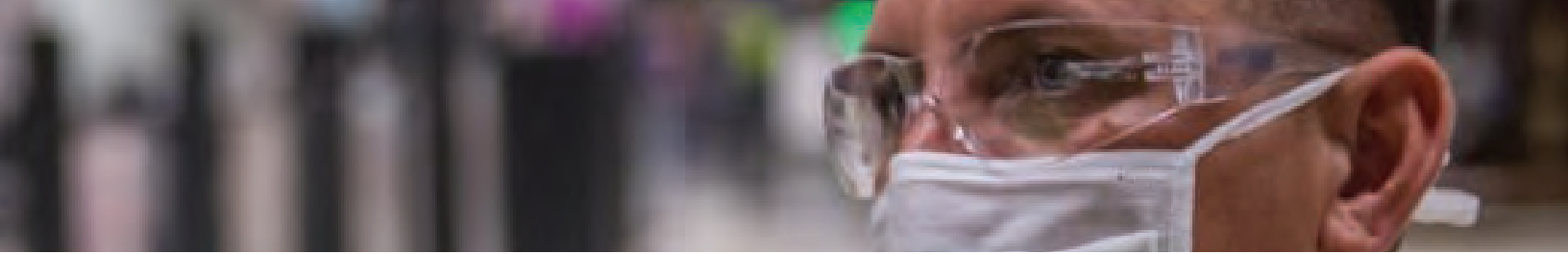
