# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It's been hard to believe that just over a year ago, life was "normal" for most of us, and we were busy living life with hardly a care in the world. We were talking about things like year-end reports, constitutional conferences, awards, homecomings and Department Convention. Department Community Service Chairman Jill Lux and I were in the 14th District visiting with District President Stacy Cusano and members. Although word of the growing pandemic was being spoken, I suppose my travel schedule had been busy and I hadn't been listening. Just days before Jill and I left for Miami, more information started to unfold about Covid-19 and awareness was beginning. We met with Gail Dupuis in Ft. Lauderdale for lunch on our way to Miami and she "armed" us with plenty of Lysol spray and wipes to use in the hotel upon arrival. I can tell you that Gail's gifts were used, and everything was sprayed down thoroughly. Looking back, it's almost something to chuckle about. On the afternoon of visit day 3, a radio announcement came across about a possible Florida shutdown. At that time, we decided that Key West would have to wait and headed home.

In so many ways, that seems like a lifetime ago. The changes we have all had in our lives have been too many to mention. Vaccinations have given many of us hope and a

For instance, Florida's membership numbers are booming! The March 17th membership report from National Headquarters shows the Department of Florida in second place with 34,217 paid members. This number puts us at 89.94% of our goal for the 2020-2021 year. The Department of Delaware is in first place with 3,191 paid members and 90.78%. This is truly something to smile about! During the worst year in over 100 years, we're doing great at renewing and recruiting members for our great organization. When we say that we're Florida Strong, I think we really mean it! I'm hoping that each of you can join in the effort to move Florida to the top in membership and prove that we are diligent in our mission, regardless of what curves get thrown our way. # DISTRICT 2

District 2 is a small rural district consisting of only SIX Units spreading over many counties. Where do I begin? It has been a year of COVID-19, Quarantine, and drive-by food pantries. Drive-Thru is the new way of life today, first testing centers for Covid, receiving flu shots, and now receiving Covid-1 and Covid 2 vaccinations, whatever it takes to "Stay safe,!" Some of us remember a Drive-In as a place to watch a movie on a big screen in the past. Where does the time go!

Unit 13 has been holding Zoom meetings for both the Executive and General membership meetings. There are both Pros and Cons of not holding in-person meetings. Some units are holding in-person meetings, and some are not having meetings at all. In October, Unit 13 held an Arts & Craft Fair with proceeds going toward the Bell Tower project spearheaded by the AMVETS for the Tallahassee National Cemetery. Imagine heading TAPS and chimes during the day from the cemetery. The "CARILLON" will have a catalog of over 700 songs to include all military service songs.

Wreaths Across America, the Tallahassee National Cemetery limited access to ONLY family members with loved ones interred were welcome to lay a wreath at their loved one's headstone, volunteers were asked not to show to lay wreaths. There was NO ceremony this year.

Every Wednesday, Unit 82, Lanark Village distributes food to low-income families, a program that's called "Farm Share." Florida Farmers sponsor Farm Share to provides nutritious food, which generally includes fresh vegetables, juices, eggs, milk, bread, chips, meats, etc. However, they never know what will

be available until pick-up. Lanark Post and Auxiliary members travel to the Farm Share facility in Quincy twice a month, then twice a month, the big red Farm Share truck delivers the commodities to Lanark. Those commodities are divided into four equal shares; three shares go to the surrounding designated areas for distribution. Lanark keeps one-fourth for distribution at Post 82.

Unit 241, Sneads held their annual Halloween Costume Party as a drive-by; still, everyone was in costume and masked. These ladies serve between 400-500 children and adults during this yearly event.

As May and National Poppy Day approach, I'm saddened to say many businesses have not opened their doors to the American Legion Auxiliary to distribute poppies locally.

The Units are continuing to update their Constitution and Bylaws and Standing Rules. Several units have sent pictures to "Mail Call" as their events take place. The Mission Statement, "In the Spirit of Service, Not Self," honors the sacrifice of those who served, benefiting our veterans and their families. District 2 would like to thank the Department Staff for a job well done during these tough COVID times, keeping us focused on what matters and our members' safety.

Our Motto, "If you hit a rock and fall over, pick yourself up and ride again." Covid has knocked our socks off; however, we are "FLORIA STRONG" and ready to resume again!
