You are all are certainly building houses! **We now have 5 units that have reached their 100% Membership goal!** Congratulations to D2 Unit 100 Marianna (105.88 %); D4 Unit 230 Hawthorne 111.43%; D5 Unit 372 Mandarin 106.06%; D6 Unit 112 Winter Park 106.90; D13 Unit 415 Babcock Ranch 192.31 and D17 Unit 293 Interlachen 258.33. Just as exciting, we have 22 units that have already achieved 75% or above! They have already exceeded the Department goal of 75% by December 7 Pearl Harbor Day!! Way to Go!!

All over quotas will be awarded starting February 3, 2025. All outstanding invoices must be paid prior processing any girls state registrations. Form 990, SunBiz, Department of Ag documentation must be emailed by the unit treasurer to alaflhq@alafl.org. District Presidents must email unit visitation forms to alaflhq@alafl.org. Any change in the unit treasurer email, email treasurer@alafl.org with the new email address. Any

change in the membership email, email membership@alafl.org with the new email address. **All email correspondence to Department must include the unit number and person's name sending the email.** The MCR will include the amount(s) of the online renewals. Monies are awarded to the units with the month end amount. Units must have an ACH and unit treasurer email on file in order to receive any

Any forms that require a check (membership, poppy order, poppy rec, etc.) must include a check with the order. **Do not staple the check to any documentation.** Removing the staple may cause the check to rip and not be usable, thus delaying the processing of that request. Be sure to check our website at alafl.org (forms and resources) for the most current forms.

Ho, Ho, Ho! There are so many opportunities to improve the lives of our Veterans, military families, and the community this December.

Among these are presents, care packages, love boxes for the homeless, holiday meal baskets, blood donation, National Wreaths Across America Day, and spending Christmas with loved ones.

What better way to highlight who we are, what we do, and why we matter, than by wearing branded apparel and taking those high quality mission-in-action photos (check out the collage). From painting a veteran's home, serving food to the homeless, giving a military child a gift, laying a wreath. When sending these photos to National or local media, use high-resolution jpeg format, if sending photos from your phone, always select the largest file size (Actual Size), and tell your unit story using the 5 W's (who, what, when, where, and why). My tip, always put

windows and light behind you (if you are taking the photo), and wipe your lens with a soft cleaning cloth. There is a great article about publishable photos that was on page 56-57 of the February 2019 Auxiliary Magazine, visit **legion-aux.org/magazine**.

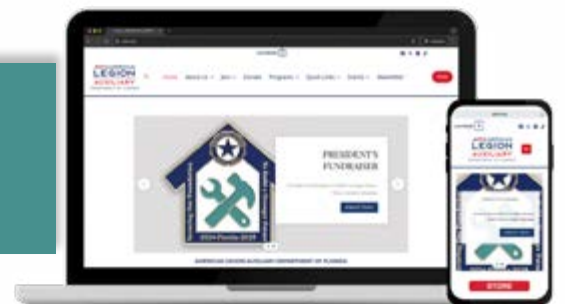
Unit 16

We were proud to host the Patriot Guard Riders Walls in October. Our Legion Family worked together to raise money for Snowball Express which will be held in Orlando this December. Unit 45 helped with breakfast, lunch, a silent and ticket auction with all proceeds going to support the Gary Sinese Foundation's efforts to support children and families of Fallen Military and First Responder Heroes. Sandi Barrett, Children and Youth chair and also a Rider, spent months facilitating the presentation of the PGR Walls and raising more than four thousand dollars in one day. One of our Legion members and Volunteer 4 Vets leader, Greg Andries, visited the wall and found several names of people he knew in the service.

The community will purchase tickets to win the tree of their choice and the funds will help those less fortunate in our community. Unit 186, District 15: Unit 186 is entering its busiest time of the year, our holiday season. Our Unit held a luncheon on October 30, 2024, to honor our Past Presidents. Our Past Presidents Parley Chair, Annette Snyder, identified ten Past Presidents who are still in our area, and sent invitations to each of them. Six of our Past Presidents were in attendance, as well as Past District 15 Presidents Georgia McKenzie and Eileen Wilson. A delicious meal was served by the Post, and each honoree received a small floral arrangement. It was lovely to be recognized. Thank you, Annette, and your volunteers, for all you do. Our Children & Youth Christmas Raffle Basket "Build the House" was also drawn at the Veterans Day picnic. Now we move into our Christmas projects. The Auxiliary will decorate the Post dining hall and front entrance on November 25, at which time the angels will be added to the Post Christmas tree. This year we will provide Christmas gifts to students at Eastside Elementary School, a Title 1 School, and provide holiday food items to each of their families. We will also purchase gifts for the Hernando County HUD/VASH Veteran Children. The Angel Tree gift and food giveaway will take place at the Post Pavilion on December 15, 2024. The Hernando County HUD/VASH children's gifts will be picked up by their Case Manager and delivered to them. The Angel Tree Project and Food Giveaway is a lot of work, but one of our favorite and most heartwarming undertakings. Once that project is completed, we take a break and enjoy the holiday season.
