



The Power of Planning

Research shows that individuals who set specific goals and write

them down are more likely to achieve them. A well-organized planner allows you to lay out your objectives, deadlines, and key events for the year. Start by identifying department membership goals and reporting deadlines, unit/district/department meeting dates, events, and initiatives. Build your calendar around these anchor points, then add your local plans.

Not only does this reduce stress, but it also helps ensure you're prioritizing what matters most—supporting veterans, military families, and our communities.

Why a Content Calendar Works In today's fast-paced world, communication is key. A content calendar isn't just for social media or newsletters—it's a valuable tool for organizing your messaging throughout the year. Plan themes or focuses for each month in advance. For example:

- September: Honoring POW/MIA Recognition Day
- November: Veterans Day and giving thanks
- March: Women's History Month and ALA birthday

Scheduling posts, press releases, or newsletter topics ahead of time ensures consistent engagement with members and the public—and makes promoting your events much easier.

Give Yourself Time

We all want to do our best, but waiting until the last minute often leads to missed opportunities and avoidable errors. Block out time in your planner each month for preparation and review. Reflect on what worked, what didn't, and how you can adjust. Consider creating a checklist for monthly responsibilities so nothing falls through the cracks.

Pro tip: Reserve time after major events to write thank-you notes, post recaps on social media, and gather photos for future reports. You'll thank yourself later when it's time to prepare your end-of-year narrative.


Final Thoughts


