In Flanders fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row,
That mark our place: and in the sky
The larks still bravely singing fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below.
We are the dead: Short days ago,
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved: and now we lie
In Flanders fields!

Take up our quarrel with the foe
To you, from failing hands, we throw
The torch: be yours to hold it high
If ye break faith with us who die,
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields.

District Poppy Chairperson



Your Leadership Role: The District Poppy Chairperson plays a vital role in advancing the Poppy Program by serving as a mentor, educator, and resource to Units throughout the District. An important responsibility of this position is organizing and conducting the District Little Miss Poppy Contest and crowning a District Little Miss Poppy and reporting name and credentials for consideration for Department of Florida Miss Poppy.



Responsibilities

Lead & Support

- Mentor and support Unit Poppy Chairpersons.
- Promote Department goals, initiatives, and year-round engagement.
- Encourage participation in all aspects of the Poppy Program.

Educate & Inspire

- Provide training and share program resources.
- Promote the Poppy Poster Contest and Little Miss Poppy Contest.
- Encourage creative ideas that increase awareness and participation.

Build Connections

- Foster collaboration among Units and the American Legion Family.
- Share successful projects and best practices throughout the District.
- Encourage partnerships with schools, businesses, and community organizations.

Communicate

- Maintain regular communication with Unit Chairpersons.
- Share Department updates, deadlines, and resources.
- Be available to answer questions and provide guidance.

Report & Recognize

- Encourage timely submission of reports, contests, and award applications.
- Assist Units with award narratives and documentation when needed.
- Recognize outstanding Units, volunteers, and community partners.

Grow the Program

- Promote recruitment of new poppy makers when opportunities arise.
- Encourage year-round poppy awareness and community outreach.
- Inspire every Unit to participate, tell its story, and make a lasting impact.

Unit Poppy Chairperson

 **Your Leadership Role:** The Unit Poppy Chairperson serves as the local leader and advocate for the Poppy Program within their Unit and community.

Responsibilities

Educate

- Teach the history of the poppy.
- Promote year-round awareness.
- Share updates at Unit meetings.

Engage

- Organize poppy distributions.
- Build community partnerships.
- Recognize military observances.

Inspire

- Promote the Poster Contest.
- Support Little Miss Poppy.
- Involve Junior members

Support Veterans

- Educate members on appropriate uses of Poppy Funds.
- Promote projects that benefit Veterans, military members, and their families.
- Support Veteran-centered programs and activities within the community.

Tell the Story

- Share Poppy Program stories, photos, and successes with your Unit and Department.
- Promote activities through newsletters, websites, and social media.
- Encourage members to share why they wear the poppy and what it represents.

Report & Recognize

- Keep a simple record of activities, participation, and community impact.
- Submit reports, award nominations, and contest entries by established deadlines.
- Recognize volunteers, businesses, and community partners who support the Poppy Program.

Poppy Funds

Poppy Funds:

- Units shall maintain a separate accounting of their Poppy Funds.
- Units shall send to Department 25% of their net proceeds within 30 days of distribution and no later than 30 days prior to Convention, to be in good standing.
- Unit Guide



Poppy Donations Can Be Used For:

- Rehabilitation of Veterans honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces after April 6, 1917.
- Welfare of the families of Veterans of the above named period.
- Rehabilitation of hospitalized service personnel returning home and awaiting discharge who require treatment in service hospitals.
- Welfare of Veterans, active military personnel, and the families of Veterans and active military personnel of the above named period where financial and medical need is evident.
- The purchase of poppy kits and supplies used to make symbolic poppies and poppy items that will be distributed for donations to the poppy fund.
- Poppy funds are used to support three major national mission outreach activities: *National Veterans Creative Arts Festival, Honor Flight mission, and food insecurity among service members nationwide.*

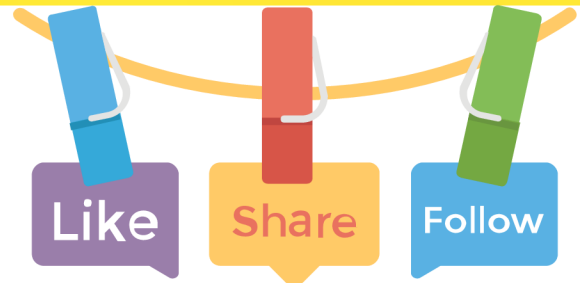


We Shall Keep the Faith

Florida Little Miss Poppy (Age 6-12)

Activity: May 1 of the current year to April 30 of the following year.

Every District is encouraged to crown a District Little Miss Poppy and submit online form, digital scrapbook, and narrative by May 1. **On the same note - any Little Miss Poppy can submit an application to National by June 1. She doesn't need to be the Little Miss Poppy chosen by the department.**

The winner's name and supporting documents will be submitted for National Little Miss Poppy.

At Department Convention...2027 Florida Little Miss Poppy will be crowned (crown, sash, and citation). She becomes the ambassador for the Poppy Program throughout the following year.

Criteria for judging Little Miss Poppy entries:

- The memorial poppy must be visible in all promotion and publicity submitted.
- There is no specific dress code or dress color for Little Miss Poppy.
- Promotion of the Poppy Program: What did you share and do?
- Publicity of poppy activities (newspapers, radio/TV, etc.).
- Submitted file must include the following information (both pictures and descriptions)
 - What I learned during my time as Little Miss Poppy?
 - How I shared the story of the poppy with my community?
 - What does the poppy mean to me?
 - What activities did I attend to promote the poppy and its meaning?
- Age-appropriate originality with considerations for neatness and creativity.

The National Little Miss Poppy (age 6-12) winner may be invited to the ALA National Convention immediately following her selection, and if she so chooses, will travel at her own expense.

The winner of the National Little Miss Poppy contest will receive a citation plaque.

Poppy Program Awards



Department Chairperson Award

Most Outstanding Unit Poppy Program - Unit Citation, One Unit Per Member Grouping. From the 6, Award Plaque (One Winner).

Recognizes outstanding achievement in promoting and supporting the Poppy Program. The entry must be typewritten in narrative format not to exceed 1,000 words. The report should cover all relevant information involving program activity describing your use of the poppies throughout the year. Pictures are encouraged with your report. Submit PDF file for the report and send photos in original format separately by email to poppy@alafl.org



***Member Grouping is based on unit membership at close of books thirty (30) days prior to Convention, see unit guide.**

Poppy Promise Award - Unit Citation, One Unit Per Member Grouping. From the 6, Award Plaque (One Winner).

Recognize Unit(s) that consistently promoted the Poppy Program throughout the year.

Criteria:

- Year-round promotion
- Social media posts
- Community education
- Veteran stories shared

Send screenshots of social media, photos in original format, timeline of promotion, send by via email to poppy@alafl.org.

Poppy Ambassador Award - Open To All Members, Citation For All That Submit. One Senior Member and One Junior/Young Member Will Be Awarded a Plaque (2).

Recognize individual members who went above and beyond promoting the Poppy Program.

Criteria:

- Community outreach
- Education efforts
- Poppy distributions
- Contest promotion
- Recruitment of volunteers

Department Award

Shirley Harbour Award (expires in 2030): Awarded to the unit submitting the best narrative, not more than 1,000 words, on 8 ½" x 11" paper, describing their promotion of the Poppy program. Report should include the number of Unit members recruited (Junior and Senior) to support Poppy Days, the community involvement in our Poppy Program, and the publicity used in the promotion of the Poppy story. Unit must have ordered a minimum of 1,000 Poppies.

Fly page to include name, number and location of the Unit, name of the Unit President and the Unit Poppy Chairman. Entry to reach Department Chairman by thirty (30) days prior to Department convention.



National Awards

Unit Award: Most Outstanding Unit Poppy Program (per division*) All unit entries must be submitted via electronic form by 5 p.m. EST on June 1.

Note: You will receive a confirmation when your award is submitted.
