NEW FROM NATIONAL

SmileAssociate is a simple, passive fundraising opportunity that turns everyday Amazon shopping into donations, at no additional cost to the shopper. Every ALA entity already has a dedicated SmileAssociate page, allowing members and supporters to shop through a unique link and generate funds for the ALA entity of their choice.

How Funds Are Distributed

When supporters begin their Amazon shopping through your entity's unique SmileAssociate link:

- ALA National Headquarters receives 5% of total sales, which is designated to support the Spirit of Youth Scholarship Fund.
- Your ALA entity receives 1.5% of the remaining 95% of sales generated through your specific link.
- Payments are made quarterly via ACH, and each participating entity receives detailed sales and donation reports.

Example: If your Department generates \$10,000 in Amazon purchases during a quarter, your Department would receive approximately \$142.50.

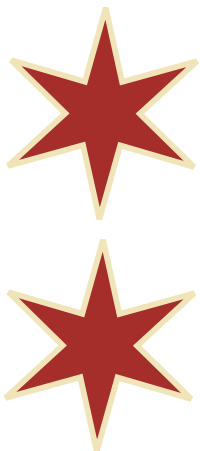

HONOR FLIGHT

I want to start by asking you to picture a scene.

It's 4:00am at the airport. A Group of many elderly veterans – some in wheelchairs, some with walkers, most wearing hats telling the story of their service, are surrounded by cheering people. They are about to board a plane to see the memorials built in their honor.

For many of these heroes, our WWII and Korean War, Vietnam, and Women veterans, this is their final chance to see the monuments that recognize their sacrifice.

The Honor Flight also recognizes the need for all veterans, regardless of when they served.

As members of Unit 113, we pride ourselves on supporting those who defended our freedom.

Today, I am asking all of us to take a special mission: To get as many of our local veterans as possible on an Honor Flight.

Veterans are humble.

They think, "Someone else deserves it more," or "I don't want to be a bother."

Vietnam Vets are the hardest to get on the planes.

Two of the Vietnam Veterans I went with on different flight needed coaxing and reassurance they are worthy and deserving. Remind them they paid for their flight by serving. Many are intimidated by the paperwork, or they are afraid of traveling because of health concerns. Women say, " Let the older ones go. They still feel they are in a man 's-only world. The Honor Flight organization wants to make sure the females get what they do for their vital roles.

That is where we come in. We are not just members; we are the bridge between a veteran and a life-

changing experience.

So, how can we help? It comes down to these things:

Identify and reach out: Look around the post, community, and families. Do you see a veteran wearing a hat? Or a license plate on the vehicle? Strike up a conversation. Ask them, "Have you ever taken an Honor Flight?" If the answer is no ask why.

Recently I was on a vacation waiting for a trolley. I struck up a conversation with a veteran about the honor flight. He said he never thought about it.

After we spoke, he said he would look into it. I was in Georgia.

Handle the application: Don't just tell them about it – help them fill out the paperwork. Bring applications for veteran and guardians to the post or help them with the application online. The online can be daunting, but with our help, it becomes easy. I helped a veteran by going online at 6:00am when he called asking if I would help him. He was struggling with it for an hour before he called me.

I keep copies of the applications that are turned in to our Legion in case they get lost in the mail and to keep a tally of who's applied.

Be the guardian or support one:

Flights need guardians or volunteers for meetings and flight days. Find a trusted family member or friend to go with them.

I was told a story recently about a veteran who was hesitant to go. He was wheelchair bound and on oxygen. He went on the trip, touched his son's name on the Vietnam memorial, and told his guardian, "I can now go home."

He passed away 4 days later.

That my friends is why we do this. We are providing closure, honor, and a "thank you" that many never received

when they first came home.

I had tears in my eyes when the 1st Vietnam veteran I was with said I won't get mail during the surprise mail call on the plane home. When his name was called, he jumped up and beamed at his envelope, in disbelief. I watch each of my veterans read the cards and letters, with joy and tears running down their faces. We call that Honor Flight allergies.

At Unit 113, we have a better awareness and friendships with all our veterans.

If you can't be a guardian, go to the Welcome Home celebration.

Yes, it's a late night, but remember these Veterans, guardians, and other volunteers have been on an almost 18-hour day. You've got to sleep in. I have been a guardian 4 times with Tina Brown, along with another auxiliary member and 2 SAL members.

When asked to be on iHeart Radio, regarding my volunteering on the Honor Flights, I nearly fell over.

I am proud to say we have gotten close to 25 Veterans on Flights within 4 years.

Let's ensure no hero in our community is left behind.

Here are a few tips:

Keep blank applications at the post or in your car.

During Veterans Day celebrations, put applications on the tables.

Fundraise for the guardians and possibly a bus. We ask private donors to sponsor the bus or transportation to and from if possible.

Check where your local Honor Flight hub is and get involved.

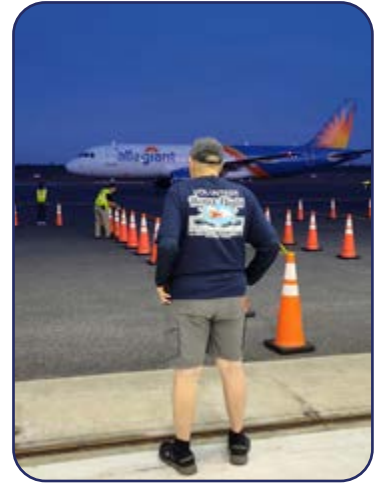

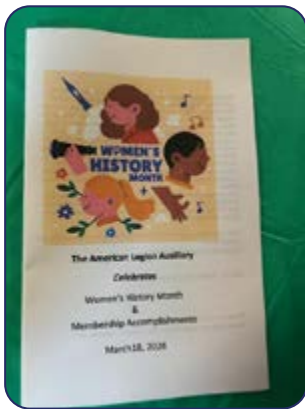

National Poppy Day was a meaningful day for American Legion Auxiliary Unit 15 in Dade City, Florida. Throughout downtown Dade City, our volunteers spent the day sharing the symbolic red poppy, educational materials, and conversations about remembrance with members of our community.

National Poppy Day serves as a reminder to honor the fallen and support veterans, active-duty military, and their families. While the poppy is never sold, donations collected during the event directly support the American Legion Auxiliary Poppy Program and other veteran-focused initiatives.

Our volunteers of all ages worked together across several downtown locations, speaking with community members about the history and meaning of the poppy while encouraging others to remember the sacrifices made by our servicemembers. The event raised \$204 in cash donations and an additional \$99 through online giving.

This year, I also participated in the National Poppy Day Virtual 5K to help raise awareness for the mission. Completing the 5K became another way to engage our community online and encourage conversations about remembrance, service, and support for veterans. Sharing the journey through social media helped connect younger audiences to the meaning behind the poppy and the work of the American Legion Auxiliary.

We are incredibly thankful for every volunteer who donated their time, energy, and heart to make this event possible. From preparing baskets and informational materials to standing outside in the Florida heat sharing the story of the poppy, their dedication helped make National Poppy Day impactful for our community.

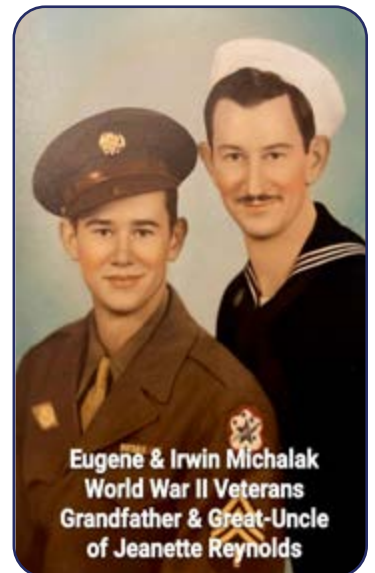
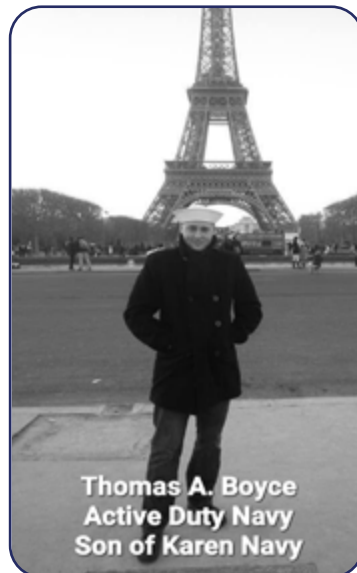
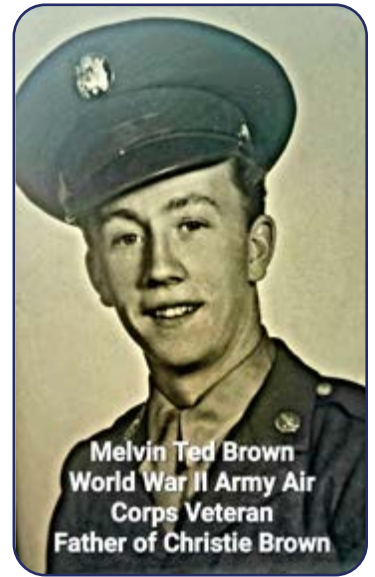
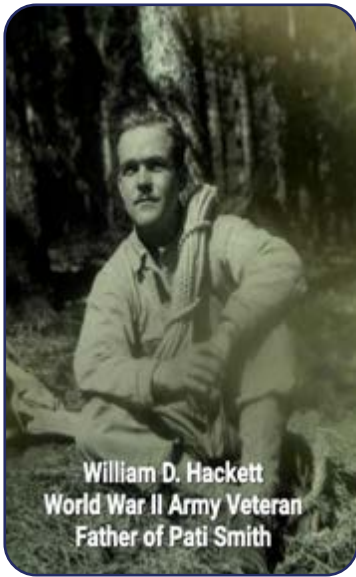
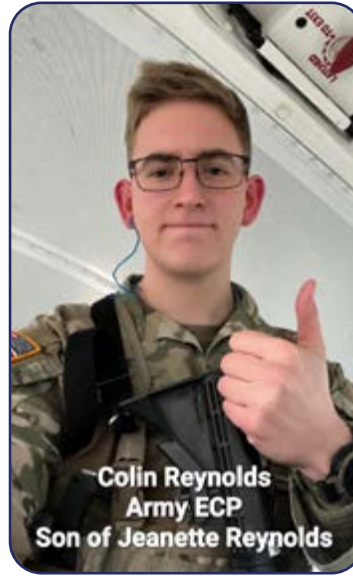
DISTRICT 13 UNIT 415
