### **GOALS for 2025 - 2026:**


- What fund-raisers do you want to bring forth?





# FROM VETERAN AFFAIRS & REHABILITATION

Thank you to everyone who participated in the Caring Heart Bear Project and brought teddy Bears to our Department workshop. We collected over 50 bears! These bears were then distributed to our hospital representatives to take them to the facilities and hand them out. Some of the stories that I have already received back have been heartfelt. One story that hit me was that of a female veteran who was handed a bear after being diagnosed with cancer. The reason for this program is to let the veterans we meet know that the American Legion Auxiliary cares for them. In researching the internet, you will find many organizations that do the same thing. The symbolism of bears represent comfort, appreciation, and a tangible token of appreciation for the veterans service. Bears are often associated with strength, courage, and grounding. Overall, to simple say Thank you for your service and you are not alone. I encourage all units to plan a time during the year and hold a unit drive for bears and then distribute them out at a community event, your local nursing home or even at an event at your post.

September is National Suicide Prevention Month. Today, the No. 1 issue facing the veteran community is suicide. The mission of The American Legion's Be The One initiative is to reduce the rate of veteran suicide. We're actively working on lessening the stigma associated with mental health treatment and empowering everyone to take appropriate action when a veteran or service member may be at risk - one life at a time. One contributing factor is posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD). PTSD is a mental health problem that some people develop after experiencing or witnessing a life-threatening event, like combat, a natural disaster, a car accident, or sexual assault. Other factors can include drug and/or alcohol abuse, depression, and other mental illnesses.

How can we help? We need to be aware of the warning signs and be open to talking about them and suicide. For more information and resources on supporting veterans, please refer to www.legion.org -Advocacy - Be The One.



On September 19th is POW/MIA - POW/MIA Recognition Day is observed on the third Friday of September, on September 19 this year, to recommit to full accountability to the families of the more than 80,000 veterans captured or still missing from wars that the United States has participated in. The POW/MIA flag symbolizes the United States' resolve to never forget POWs or those who served their country in conflicts and are still missing. Newt Heisley designed the flag. The flag's design features a silhouette of a young man, which is based on Mr. Heisley's son, who was medically discharged from the military. As Mr. Heisley looked at

his returning son's gaunt features, he imagined what life was like for those behind barbed wire fences on foreign shores. He then sketched the profile of his son as the new flag's design was created in his mind.

The flag features a white disk bearing in black silhouette a man's bust, a watch tower with a guard on patrol, and a strand of barbed wire. White letters "POW" and "MIA", with a white five-pointed star in between, are typed above the disk. Below the disk is a black and white wreath above the motto "You Are Not Forgotten" written in white, capital letters.

Focus VA&R Program of the Month This month I would like to focus on how we can help with Honor Flight. Every veteran deserves to hear two simple words: Thank you.

There are so many ways that unit members can get involved with Honor Flight. Make cards at your next unit meeting for Honor Flight mail call on the plane. Attend a homecoming and welcome the veterans back home when they return from Washington, DC. You could even bring a bear or two and a hand to veterans at the airport. Wave flags and say "thank you" to these veterans as this special day come to an end. I would encourage all units in the coming months to plan a way to get involved. In 2021, the American Legion Auxiliary entered an official collaboration with Honor Flight Inc. to support its mission to celebrate America's veterans by inviting them to share in a day of honor at our nation's memorials in Washington, D.C. The ALA signed a memorandum of understanding with Honor Flight that allows ALA units and departments to directly donate funds generated from the distribution of our poppy activities.

Caring Heart Buddy Check Week. Caring Heart bear, our VA&R mascot, would like to encourage all our members to make a Buddy check call the last week of the month. American

Once we were allowed back in, we have been there sporadically but since January, we have been scheduled for the 2nd Tuesday thanking our veterans in this small way. They are always so grateful and stop at our table to talk about their service. What always motivated us to continue this program long ago was the day we told a veteran wearing a Viet Nam War hat "Thank you for your service" and he told us that was the first time anyone ever told him thank you. As members of the American Legion Auxiliary, we feel this is unacceptable. We will keep on handing out Caring Bears on Jefferson Street throughout the year and showing our Passion for Vets!



Here is to another year of service, friendship, and PASSION for our Veterans!!






















Not Pictured from Aviata Nursing Home is Charlie McDonald who was having his Chemo treatments.
